1 A RESOLUTION recognizing January 23, 2024, as Maternal Mental Health 2 Awareness Day. 3 WHEREAS, the United States ranks highest among industrialized nations in 4 maternal mortality; and 5 WHEREAS, more than 700 women die each year in the United States as a result of 6 pregnancy or delivery complications, and more than one-half of these deaths are 7 preventable; and 8 WHEREAS, while the national maternal mortality rate continues to rise, Kentucky 9 continues to work diligently and successfully to reverse this alarming trend; and 10 WHEREAS, a woman's maternal mental health condition can be a factor in 11 maternal mortality; and 12 WHEREAS, improved screening alone can reduce the severity of postpartum 13 depression; and 14 WHEREAS, chronic health conditions increase the risk of pregnancy 15 complications, adverse birth outcomes, and pregnancy-related mortality because the 16 physical demands that pregnancy places on the body's systems can exacerbate existing 17 health conditions; and 18 WHEREAS, more needs to be done to narrow racial and ethnic disparities, 19 especially with black women whose pregnancy-related mortality ratio was four to six 20 times greater than the mortality ratios for women of other racial or ethnic groups; and 21 WHEREAS, maximizing health prior to pregnancy, including but not limited to 22 preventing smoking, improving fitness, reducing sexually transmitted diseases, and 23 promoting positive relationships, can improve maternal mental health; and 24 WHEREAS, addressing the postpartum needs of women through such efforts as 25 postpartum visits, breastfeeding support, and screening for postpartum depression can 26 help improve maternal mental health; and 27 WHEREAS, the Kentucky General Assembly seeks to bring awareness to maternal
