1	AN ACT relating to cigar bars.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 65 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) As used in this section:
6	(a) ''Cigar bar'' means an establishment that:
7	1. Holds a valid quota retail drink license, as defined in KRS Chapter
8	243, for the on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages;
9	2. Generates at least fifteen percent (15%) of its annual gross income
10	from the on-site sale of cigars, pipe tobacco, paraphernalia and
11	accessories related to the consumption of cigars and pipe tobacco, and
12	rental of humidors, or a combination thereof;
13	3. Does not knowingly sell products or services, or permit entrance to the
14	premises, to persons under twenty-one (21) years of age; and
15	4. Does not permit the use of electronic cigarettes or vapor products or
16	the smoking of products other than cigars and pipe tobacco inside
17	interior space of the cigar bar; and
18	(b) "Local government" means a city, county, urban-county government,
19	consolidated local government, charter county government, unified local
20	government, or special district.
21	(2) (a) The operation of cigar bars, and the smoking of cigars and pipe tobacco
22	within the interior or exterior space of a cigar bar, shall be authorized
23	within the Commonwealth in any area where other establishments that meet
24	the qualifications of paragraph (a)1. of subsection (1) of this section are
25	permitted to operate. The operation of a cigar bar is subject to other state
26	and local government laws not in conflict with this section, including but
27	not limited to any land use ordinances generally applicable to licensees

1			described in subparagraph (a)1. of subsection (1) of this section.
2		<u>(b)</u>	A local government may enact an ordinance requiring a cigar bar to obtain
3			an annual permit from the local government for its operation. The
4			ordinance may require an inspection of facilities and other information and
5			documentation to ensure the applicant complies with the requirements of
6			this section. The amount of any permit fee:
7			1. Shall be reasonable and consistent with permit fees for other similar
8			businesses; and
9			2. Shall not exceed the costs of policing, regulating, and administering
10			the cigar bar pursuant to applicable law.
11	<u>(3)</u>	(a)	A cigar bar that shares a physical wall or common, enclosed air space with
12			any other structure shall implement measures or be constructed in a
13			manner to ensure that smoke from the cigar bar does not pass into the
14			interior or enclosed air spaces of those other structures.
15		<u>(b)</u>	The owner of a cigar bar shall provide a smoke-free space for the delivery of
16			supplies, mail, and other items to the premises by persons other than
17			employees and patrons of the cigar bar.
18		<u>(c)</u>	A cigar bar shall provide notice that an individual entering its premises will
19			be exposed to cigar and pipe tobacco smoke in the establishment and that
20			smoking or vaporizing of inhalants other than cigars or pipe tobacco is
21			prohibited. The notice shall be placed in a conspicuous place at each
22			entrance to the establishment where an entrant may be exposed to cigar or
23			pipe tobacco smoke.
