1	AN ACT relating to disaster relief, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring
2	an emergency.
3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 39A IS CREATED TO
5	READ AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) As used in this section:
7	(a) "Declaration" means the Presidential Declaration of a Major Disaster,
8	designated FEMA-4860-DR-KY;
9	(b) ''Kentucky disaster'' means the severe storms, straight-line winds, flooding,
10	and landslides that occurred in Kentucky beginning on February 14, 2025,
11	as named in the declaration; and
12	(c) "SAFE 4860 fund" means the State Aid Funding for Emergencies 4860
13	fund established in subsection (2) of this section.
14	(2) The State Aid Funding for Emergencies 4860 fund is established and shall be:
15	(a) Administered by the Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency
16	Management, in accordance with this section; and
17	(b) A separate fund to provide financial support for those directly impacted by
18	the Kentucky disaster.
19	(3) (a) The SAFE 4860 fund may receive state appropriations, gifts, grants, federal
20	funds, and any other funds, both public and private.
21	(b) Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, moneys in the SAFE 4860 fund shall not
22	lapse and shall carry forward until June 30, 2028.
23	(c) Any interest earnings of the SAFE 4860 fund shall become a part of the
24	fund and shall not lapse.
25	(4) The Department of Military Affairs or the Division of Emergency Management
26	shall not publicly advertise or solicit contributions from the general public that
27	<u>could potentially impact fundraising efforts of nonprofit disaster relief agencies.</u>

1	(5) (a)	Eligibility to receive financial support from the SAFE 4860 fund shall be		
2		limited to a:		
3		<u>1. City, county, urban-county government, consolidated local</u>		
4		government, unified local government, or charter county government;		
5		2. Nonprofit or public utility service provider;		
6		3. State agency; or		
7		<u>4. School district;</u>		
8		that has disaster-related needs as a result of the Kentucky disaster.		
9	<u>(b)</u>	An eligible recipient may receive moneys from the SAFE 4860 fund for		
10		expenses to provide disaster and recovery relief if the recipient is located in		
11		the areas of the Kentucky disaster and has disaster-related needs in		
12		response to the Kentucky disaster.		
13	<u>(6) (a)</u>	Eligible expenses shall be those used to support disaster and recovery relief,		
14		including but not limited to:		
15		1. a. Replacement or renovation of publicly owned buildings damaged		
16		by the Kentucky disaster, but only to the extent of damage		
17		directly caused by the Kentucky disaster; and		
18		<u>b. Replacement, renovation, or expansion of an essential</u>		
19		government facility that was used for existing services at the time		
20		of the Kentucky disaster, including police, fire, and ambulance		
21		stations, functioning above capacity at the time of application,		
22		but only to the extent of damage directly caused by the Kentucky		
23		<u>disaster:</u>		
24		2. Reimbursement for services, personnel, and equipment provided		
25		during the response and recovery to communities impacted by the		
26		Kentucky disaster, but only to the extent of damage directly caused by		
27		<u>the Kentucky disaster;</u>		

1	<u>3. Funding to c</u>	ities, counties, and publicly owned utilities for the costs
2	<u>of:</u>	
3	<u>a. Replace</u>	ment or repair of publicly owned buildings and their
4	contents	; and
5	<u>b. Water a</u>	nd wastewater infrastructure and those systems supports;
6	<u>due to the dar</u>	nage from the Kentucky disaster, but only to the extent of
7	<u>damage direc</u>	tly caused by the Kentucky disaster;
8	<u>4. Assistance to</u>	cities and counties for expenses related to planning
9	<u>efforts for rel</u>	building and recovering from the Kentucky disaster, but
10	only to the ex	tent of damage directly caused by the Kentucky disaster;
11	5. Assistance to	support disaster recovery and relief needs of local school
12	districts, but o	only to the extent of loss or damage directly caused by the
13	<u>Kentucky disc</u>	uster, including but not limited to financial support:
14	<u>a.</u> For sch	nool districts that will experience a default in bond
15	paymen	ts; and
16	<u>b. To assi</u>	st school districts with building and tangible property
17	replacer	nent needs; and
18	<u>6. Contracted en</u>	nployees to administer and report on the funds.
19	(b) The financial supp	ort shall not cover any new construction inside the one
20	<u>hundred (100) year</u>	floodplain area.
21	(7) Each recipient of mone	ys from the SAFE 4860 fund, including any agency of
22	Kentucky state governme	ent, shall:
23	<u>(a) Retain documenta</u>	ution of a timely application for any applicable
24	<u>reimbursement, in</u>	cluding but not limited to federal emergency disaster
25	grant assistance,	other financial disaster assistance, and insurance
26	proceeds; and	
27	(b) Adhere to the terms	s of the SAFE 4860 fund regarding reimbursement to the

1		Commonwealth if funds from other sources are subsequently received after
2		the receipt of financial assistance from the Commonwealth.
3	<u>(8) (a)</u>	Moneys in the SAFE 4860 fund may be used for the advancement of
4		moneys to cities, counties, school districts, and nonprofit or public utility
5		service providers experiencing strained fiscal liquidity while awaiting
6		reimbursement from federal emergency management assistance or
7		insurance claims and shall not be used for capital improvements.
8	<u>(b)</u>	Reimbursement of the advancement under paragraph (a) of this subsection
9		<u>shall:</u>
10		1. Be determined by the:
11		a. State-local finance officer within the Department for Local
12		Government for cities and counties, and nonprofit or public
13		utilities; and
14		b. Department of Education for school districts; and
15		2. Include a quarterly accounting of the advancement released and the
16		outstanding balance through June 30, 2028.
17	<u>(9) (a)</u>	If a recipient of moneys from the SAFE 4860 fund subsequently receives
18		moneys from any other source, the recipient shall reimburse the
19		Commonwealth for the amount of the moneys received from the SAFE 4860
20		<u>fund.</u>
21	<u>(b)</u>	Before July 1, 2028, all moneys reimbursed to the Commonwealth under
22		paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be deposited in the SAFE 4860 fund
23		within thirty (30) days.
24	<u>(c)</u>	After June 30, 2028, all moneys reimbursed to the Commonwealth under
25		paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be deposited in the budget reserve
26		trust fund account established in KRS 48.705 within thirty (30) days.
27	<u>(10) The</u>	Division of Emergency Management shall promulgate administrative

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1	regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A to carry out this section.
2	(11) The following reports shall be submitted to the Senate Standing Committee on
3	Appropriations and Revenue and the House Standing Committee on
4	Appropriations and Revenue or the Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations
5	and Revenue by the fifteenth day of each month, beginning May 15, 2025, and
6	<u>ending July 15, 2029:</u>
7	(a) A report from the Office of State Budget Director that includes:
8	1. The name of each recipient of moneys from the SAFE 4860 fund;
9	2. The dollar amount of moneys issued and the dates of issuance;
10	3. The dollar amount of any proceeds received from the Federal
11	Emergency Management Agency, an insurance company, or any other
12	means of reimbursement for damages;
13	4. A description of how the moneys were used; and
14	5. A list of all requests:
15	a. Submitted, including the amount requested;
16	b. Denied, including a description of the reason for the denial; and
17	c. Where the amount awarded was greater than or less than the
18	amount requested, including a description of the reason for the
19	increase or decrease; and
20	(b) A report from the Department of Education that includes:
21	1. The name of each school district receiving moneys from the SAFE
22	<u>4860 fund;</u>
23	2. The dollar amount of moneys issued and the dates of issuance;
24	3. The dollar amount of any proceeds received from the Federal
25	Emergency Management Agency, an insurance company, or any other
26	means of reimbursement for damages;
27	4. A description of how the moneys were used; and

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1	5. A list of all requests:
2	a. Submitted, including the amount requested;
3	b. Denied, including a description of the reason for the denial; and
4	c. Where the amount awarded was greater than or less than the
5	amount requested, including a description of the reason for the
6	increase or decrease.
7	→Section 2. 2024 Ky. Acts ch. 175, Part III, 24. Budget Implementation, at page
8	1936, is amended to read as follows:
9	24. Budget Implementation: (1) The General Assembly directs that the
10	Executive Branch shall carry out all appropriations and budgetary language provisions as
11	contained in the State/Executive Branch Budget. The Legislative Research Commission
12	shall review quarterly expenditure data to determine if an agency is out of compliance
13	with this directive. If the Legislative Research Commission suspects that any entity has
14	acted in non-conformity with this section, the Legislative Research Commission may
15	order an audit or review at the agency's expense. Such audit findings, reviews, and
16	reports shall be subject to the Kentucky Open Records Law. The Secretary of each
17	Cabinet, the Commissioner of Education, or agency head shall provide, <i>in the form and</i>
18	manner prescribed by the Legislative Research Commission, a comprehensive
19	semiannual report, beginning February 1, 2025, to the standing Appropriations and
20	Revenue Committees of the General Assembly or the Interim Joint Committee on
21	Appropriations and Revenue, as appropriate, detailing expenditures related to the
22	appropriations contained within the budgetary language provisions for each budget unit
23	within their cabinet.
24	If an agency does not expend the full General Fund appropriation contained within

If an agency does not expend the full General Fund appropriation contained within
a budgetary language provision, the unexpended funds shall be transferred to the Budget
Reserve Trust Fund Account (KRS 48.705).

(2) Notwithstanding any statute to the contrary, the Governor may transfer the

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1 remaining appropriations set forth in 2022 Ky. Acts ch. 222, sec. 6, and 2022 (1st

2 Extra. Sess.) Ky. Acts ch. 1, sec. 7, to the SAFE 4860 Fund.

3 → Section 3. 2024 Ky Acts, ch. 175, Part I, Operating Budget, A. General
4 Government, 6. Military Affairs, (1) Kentucky National Guard, at page 1808, is amended
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) Kentucky National Guard: Included in the above General Fund 7 appropriation is \$4,500,000 in each fiscal year to be expended, subject to the conditions 8 and procedures provided in this Act, which are required as a result of the Governor's 9 declaration of emergency pursuant to KRS Chapter 39A, and the Governor's call of the 10 Kentucky National Guard to active duty when an emergency or exigent situation has been 11 declared to exist by the Governor. Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any portion of the 12 \$4,500,000 not expended shall lapse to the Budget Reserve Trust Fund Account (KRS 13 48.705) at the end of each fiscal year. In the event that costs for Governor-declared 14 emergencies or the Governor's call of the Kentucky National Guard for emergencies or 15 exigent situations exceed \$4,500,000 annually, up to \$100,000,000 for the 2024-2026 16 fiscal biennium [\$50,000,000] shall be deemed necessary government expenses and shall 17 be paid from the General Fund Surplus Account (KRS 48.700) or the Budget Reserve Trust Fund Account (KRS 48.705). 18

Section 4. Whereas support and relief efforts are imperative for the
Commonwealth to recover from the considerable damage caused by the recent disasters
in this state, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage
and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
