

1 AN ACT relating to general obligation bonds.

2 ***Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

3 ➔Section 1. KRS 45.812 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1) **(a)** Prior to the issuance of the **general obligation bonds**, revenue bonds, or notes  
5 authorized by an appropriation of the General Assembly, or by or on behalf of  
6 any Kentucky school district, the agency, corporation, or school district  
7 authorized to issue the bonds or notes shall furnish to the Capital Projects and  
8 Bond Oversight Committee and the Interim Joint Committee on  
9 Appropriations and Revenue, and make available to the public, a listing of all  
10 costs associated, either directly or indirectly, with the issuance of the **general**  
11 **obligation bonds**, revenue bonds, or notes.

12 **(b)** The costs shall be itemized as to amount and name of payee, and shall include  
13 fees or commissions paid to, or anticipated to be paid to, issuers, underwriters,  
14 placement agents and advisors, financial advisors, remarketing agents, credit  
15 enhancers, trustees, accountants, and the counsel of all these persons, bond  
16 counsel, and special tax counsel, and shall include the economic benefits  
17 received or anticipated to be received by any other persons from any source in  
18 return for services performed relating to the issuance of the bonds or notes.

19 **(c)** Changes in amounts or names of payees or recipients, or additions of amounts  
20 or names of payees or recipients, to the listing furnished and made available  
21 pursuant to this subsection, shall be furnished to the Capital Projects and  
22 Bond Oversight Committee and the Interim Joint Committee on  
23 Appropriations and Revenue and made available to the public within three (3)  
24 days following the change.

25 (2) The costs required to be furnished under the provisions of subsection (1) of this  
26 section shall not include the payment of wages or expenses to full-time, permanent  
27 employees of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

➔Section 2. 2024 Kentucky Acts Chapter 173, Section 1, at pages 1756 to 1769, as amended by 2024 Kentucky Acts Chapter 223, at pages 2343 to 2347, is amended to read as follows:

Notwithstanding KRS 141.020(2)(a)2., the appropriations contained in this section are supported solely by funds from the Budget Reserve Trust Fund Account established by KRS 48.705 and shall not be identified as GF appropriations when certifying the reduction conditions pursuant to KRS 141.020(2)(a)5. and (d)2. to 5.
