5		(a)	"Cannabidiol" means a non-psychoactive cannabinoid found in the hemp	
6			plant Cannabis sativa which has the chemical name 2-[(1R,6R)-3-methyl-6-	
7			prop-1-en-2-ylcyclohex-2-en-1-yl]-5-pentylbenzene-1,3-diol;	
8		(b)	"Certificate of analysis" means a document produced by a laboratory that has	
9			been accredited pursuant to standards of the International Organization for	
10			Standardization, attesting to the composition of a product. The certificate of	
11			analysis shall include but not be limited to the amount of delta-9	
12			tetrahydrocannabinol, the amount of other cannabinoids, the amount of	
13			pesticide residues, the amount of heavy metal traces, the amount of mycotoxir	
14			contaminants, the amount of residual solvents, and the amount of	
15			microbiological contaminants;	
16		(c)	"Hemp" has the same meaning as in KRS 260.850; and	
17		(d)	"Quick response code" or "QR code" means a type of machine-readable, two	
18			(2) dimensional bar code that stores information about a product.	
19	(2)	A m	anufacturer or processor of ingestible or cosmetic cannabidiol products located	
20		in K	entucky shall:	
21		(a)	Be permitted as a food manufacturer or a cosmetic manufacturer by the	
22			cabinet and shall provide the following information:	
23			1. The name of the manufacturer or processor and the physical address	
24			where production or processing occurs; and	
25			2. A listing of the cannabidiol products to be produced or processed; and	
26		(b)	Obtain a certificate of analysis for all cannabidiol products to be sold or	

otherwise distributed in the Commonwealth.

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1 (3) All ingestible or cosmetic cannabidiol products sold or otherwise distributed in the 2 Commonwealth shall bear labeling to allow the consumer to access information on 3 the product, including a certificate of analysis for the product, the location where the hemp was grown, and the address and phone number of the manufacturer or 4 distributor using the following: 5 6 (a) A scannable bar code, including the batch number or serial number of the 7 product;

- 8 (b) A QR code; or
- 9 (c) A web address linked to a document or <u>website</u>[Web site].
- 10 (4) <u>A[No]</u> product labeling or advertising material for any ingestible or cosmetic
 11 cannabidiol product sold or otherwise distributed in the Commonwealth shall <u>not</u>
 12 bear any claims stating that the product can diagnose, treat, cure, or prevent any
 13 disease.
- 14 (5) The cabinet shall promulgate administrative regulations *in accordance with KRS*15 *Chapter 13A* to establish labeling requirements for ingestible or cosmetic

 16 cannabidiol products in accordance with [the provisions of] this section.
- 17 (6) Beverages containing cannabidiol or other cannabinoid products shall be subject

 18 to this section, except that the cabinet shall promulgate administrative regulations

 19 to establish labeling and other requirements for beverages containing

 20 cannabidiol or other cannabinoid products separately from any other

 - → Section 2. The University of Kentucky Cannabis Center shall study the various aspects of the manufacture, testing procedures, distribution, sale, and consumer effects of beverages containing cannabidiol or other cannabinoid products. The center may consult with other entities as a part of its study, and shall report the results of its study to the Legislative Research Commission by January 1, 2026.
- 27 → Section 3. Beverages containing cannabidiol or other cannabinoid products

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shall not be sold at retail in the Commonwealth on or after the effective date of this Act,

- 2 and before July 1, 2026.
- 3 → Section 4. Whereas it is crucial to protect the public from potentially unsafe
- 4 consumer products, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its
- 5 passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
