The center shall annually provide a report on the data to the Interim Joint Committee on Education.

- 7 (8) (a) The Dual Credit Scholarship Program trust fund is hereby created as a trust
 8 fund in the State Treasury to be administered by the Kentucky Higher
 9 Education Assistance Authority for the purpose of providing scholarships
 10 described in this section.
 - (b) The trust fund shall consist of state general fund appropriations, gifts and grants from public and private sources, and federal funds. [All moneys included in the fund shall be appropriated for the purposes set forth in this section.]
 - (c) Any <u>unallotted</u>[unalloted] or unencumbered balances in the trust fund shall be invested as provided in KRS 42.500(9). Income earned from the investments shall be credited to the trust fund.
