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AN ACT relating to teachers.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

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→ Section 1. KRS 161.030 is amended to read as follows:

4 Notwithstanding the age of the pupil, the certification of all teachers and other (1)school personnel, in public schools only, is vested in the Education Professional 5 Standards Board. When so certified, teachers and other school personnel shall not 6 7 be required to have licensure, certification, or other forms of approval from any 8 other state agency for the performance of their respective assignments within the 9 system of public schools, except as provided for by law. All certificates authorized 10 under KRS 161.010 to 161.126 shall be issued in accordance with the 11 administrative regulations of the Education Professional Standards Board.[After 12 July 15, 1994,] All certificate applications and other data collection instruments of 13 the board shall include a request for voluntary information about the applicant's 14 ethnic background. This information shall be available to help local school districts 15 locate minority candidates. A person who holds a certificate prior to this 16 requirement may request that ethnic information be added to his or her file. Nothing in this section shall preclude the right of an individual in a nonpublic school from 17 18 seeking voluntary certification by the Education Professional Standards Board.

(2) Certificates shall be issued upon written application and in accordance with statutes
and regulations in effect at the time of application to persons who have completed,
at colleges, universities, or local school district programs approved by the
Education Professional Standards Board for the preparation of teachers and other
school personnel, the curricula prescribed by the administrative regulations of the
Education Professional Standards Board.

(3) [(a)]Certification of all new teachers and teachers seeking additional certification
 shall require the successful completion of appropriate <u>and approved teacher</u>
 preparation programs[assessments] prior to certification.[The assessments shall be

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1	selected by the Education Professional Standards Board and shall measure
2	knowledge in the specific teaching field of the applicant, including content of the
3	field and teaching of that content. The Education Professional Standards Board
4	shall determine the minimum acceptable level of achievement on each assessment.
5	The assessments shall measure those concepts, ideas, and facts which are being
6	taught in teacher education programs in Kentucky.] Upon successful completion of
7	an[the assessments and the] approved teacher preparation program, a professional
8	certificate valid for five (5) years shall be issued.
9	[(b) If an applicant for teacher certification has completed the approved teacher
10	preparation program and has taken but failed to successfully complete the
11	appropriate assessments selected by the Education Professional Standards
12	Board, a conditional certificate may be issued for a period not to exceed one
13	(1) year. The employing school district, in collaboration with the teacher
14	education institution, shall provide technical assistance and mentoring support
15	to the conditionally certified teacher. The teacher shall retake the assessments
16	during the validity period of the conditional certificate. The conditional
17	certificate shall not be reissued. Upon successful completion of the required
18	assessments, a professional certificate valid for five (5) years shall be issued.
19	The Education Professional Standards Board shall promulgate administrative
20	regulations to establish the standards and procedures for issuance of a
21	conditional certificate.
22	(c) If an out-of state teacher with less than two (2) years' experience comes to
23	Kentucky after the deadline for taking the assessments, a temporary certificate
24	may be issued for a period up to six (6) months. The teacher shall take the

assessments during the period of the temporary certificate. If the teacher fails
 the assessments, the temporary certificate shall be valid only for the current
 semester. If the teacher passes the assessments, a professional certificate valid

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for five (5) years shall be issued.

8	cont	identiality of the individual assessment scores. Scores shall be available only to

11	in th	e assessment for certification of new teachers and of out of state teachers with
12	less	than two (2) years of teaching experience who are seeking initial certification

14	<u>(4)</u> [(5)]	If an applicant establishes eligibility for a five (5) year professional certificate
15	und	r[the provisions of] subsection $(3)[(3)(a)]$ of this section, the applicant shall
16	also	be eligible for the issuance of a certificate for substitute teaching as provided
17	by t	e administrative regulations of the Education Professional Standards Board.
18	<u>(5)[(6)]</u>	(a) The Education Professional Standards Board shall issue a ten (10) year
19		emeritus certificate to an applicant who has:
20		1. Retired or will retire not more than one (1) year prior to the expiration

 5 forth in administrative regulation promulgated by the Education
 6 Professional Standards Board;
- Who completed three (3) years of classroom instruction prior to the
 certificate's expiration; and
- 9 5. Who has completed the required application unless the provisions of
 10 KRS 161.120 apply.

11 <u>(6)</u>[(7)] The Education Professional Standards Board shall approve the curricula of 12 any college or university, or of any department thereof, for the training of teachers, 13 and any nontraditional or alternative teacher preparation program offered in a 14 public or private postsecondary education institution, private contractor, or state 15 agency, and shall also approve the curricula of any local district alternative 16 certification program, when the curricula comply with the administrative 17 regulations of the Education Professional Standards Board for the issuance of 18 certificates and when the institution has met the terms and conditions provided in 19 KRS 161.010 to 161.120. Any student who has completed any of these curricula, as 20 approved by the Education Professional Standards Board, and who has completed 21 the prescribed requirements for the issuance of certificates shall be granted a 22 certificate corresponding to the curricula completed.

<u>(7)</u>[(8)] The issuance of any certificate, except emergency certificates issued pursuant
 to KRS 161.100, by the Education Professional Standards Board shall not be
 dependent upon an offer of employment. The certification process, except for
 emergency certificates, is independent of any job prospects and certification shall
 be awarded on the basis of completing a teacher preparation program or an

4 Option 2: Certification through a local school district training program. A local (3)school district or group of school districts may seek approval for a training 5 6 program. The state-approved local school district training program is an alternative 7 to the college teacher preparation program as a means of acquiring teacher 8 certification for a teacher at any grade level. The training program may be offered 9 for all teaching certificates approved by the Education Professional Standards 10 Board, including interdisciplinary early childhood education, except for specific 11 certificates for teachers of exceptional children. To participate in a state-approved 12 local school district alternative training program, the candidate shall possess:

13 (a) A bachelor's degree or a graduate degree; *and*

(b) A minimum cumulative grade point average of two and seventy-five
hundredths (2.75) on a four (4) point scale or a minimum grade point average
of three (3) on a four (4) point scale on the last thirty (30) hours of credit
completed, including undergraduate and graduate coursework from a
nationally or regionally accredited postsecondary institution[; and

(c) A passing score on the academic content assessment in the area in which
 certification is being sought by the applicant as designated by the Education
 Professional Standards Board. To be eligible to take an academic content
 assessment, the applicant shall have completed a thirty (30) hour major in the
 academic content area or five (5) years of experience in the academic content
 area as approved by the Education Professional Standards Board].

An individual may participate in a local school district training program upon meeting the participation requirements as established in this subsection and approval by the Education Professional Standards Board of an application by the

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individual. The candidate shall be issued a one (1) year provisional certificate by the Education Professional Standards Board. After successful completion of the local school district training program, one (1) year of teaching, and upon the recommendation of the employing school district to the Education Professional Standards Board, the candidate shall receive a professional certificate and shall be subject to certificate renewal requirements the same as other teachers with a professional certificate.

- 8 (4) Option 3: Certification of a professional from a postsecondary institution: A
 9 candidate who possesses the following qualifications may receive a one (1) year
 10 provisional certificate for teaching at any level:
- (a) A master's degree or doctoral degree in the academic content area for which
 certification is sought; and
- (b) A minimum of five (5) years of full-time teaching experience, or its
 equivalent, in the academic content area for which certification is sought in a
 regionally or nationally accredited institution of higher education.

After successful completion of one (1) year of teaching and upon the recommendation of the employing school district to the Education Professional Standards Board, the candidate shall receive a professional certificate and shall be subject to certificate renewal requirements the same as other teachers with professional certificates.

- (5) Option 4: Certification of an adjunct instructor. A person who has expertise in areas
 such as art, music, foreign language, drama, science, computer science, and other
 specialty areas may be employed as an adjunct instructor in a part-time position by
 a local board of education under KRS 161.046.
- 25 (6) Option 5: Certification of a veteran of the Armed Forces. The Education
 26 Professional Standards Board shall issue a statement of eligibility, valid for five (5)
 27 years, for teaching at the elementary, secondary, and secondary career technical

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education levels to a veteran of the Armed Forces who was honorably discharged
 from active duty as evidenced by Defense Department Form 214 (DD 214) or
 National Guard Bureau Form 22 or to a member of the Armed Services currently
 serving with six (6) or more years of honorable service, including Reserves,
 National Guard, or active duty. The candidate shall possess:

- 6 (a) A bachelor's degree or graduate degree;
- (b) A minimum cumulative grade point average of two and seventy-five
 hundredths (2.75) on a four (4) point scale or a minimum grade point average
 of three (3) on a four (4) point scale on the last thirty (30) hours of credit
 completed, including undergraduate and graduate coursework from a
 nationally or regionally accredited postsecondary institution; and
- 12 (c) An academic major [or a passing score on the academic content assessment
 13]in the area in which certification is being sought by the applicant as
 14 designated by the Education Professional Standards Board.
- The eligible veteran shall receive a one (1) year provisional certificate with approval by the Education Professional Standards Board of an application by the veteran. After successful completion of one (1) year of teaching and upon the recommendation of the employing school district to the Education Professional Standards Board, the veteran shall receive a professional certificate.
- 20 Option 6: University alternative program. With approval of the Education (7)21 Professional Standards Board, a university may provide an alternative program that 22 enrolls students in a postbaccalaureate teacher preparation program concurrently 23 with employment as a teacher in a local school district. A student in the alternative 24 program shall be granted a one (1) year provisional certificate. The one (1) year 25 provisional certificate may be renewed four (4) additional years, and shall be 26 contingent upon the candidate's continued enrollment in the preparation program 27 and compliance with all requirements established by the board. A professional

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certificate shall be issued upon the teacher candidate's successful completion of the
 program [and all academic content assessments]in the specific teaching field of the
 applicant as designated by the Education Professional Standards Board, and upon
 the recommendation of the employing school district.

5 (8) Option 7: Certification of a person in a field other than education to teach in
6 elementary, middle, or secondary programs. This option shall not be limited to
7 teaching in shortage areas. An individual certified under[-provisions of] this
8 subsection shall be issued a one (1) year provisional certificate, renewable for a
9 maximum of four (4) additional years with approval of the Education Professional
10 Standards Board.

- 11 (a) The candidate shall possess:
- A bachelor's degree with a declared academic major in the area in which
 certification is sought or a graduate degree in a field related to the area
 in which certification is sought; and
