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- 4 (1) The board shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS
- 5 Chapter 13A relating to dental hygienists. The administrative regulations may
- 6 include at a minimum the classification of and licensure of dental hygienists, by
- 7 examination or credentials, general supervision privileges, anesthesia registration,
- 8 retirement of a license, reinstatement of a license, and charity licenses.
- 9 (2) Renewal programs shall be organized to include continuing education approved by the board.
- 11 (3) A licensed dental hygienist shall practice under the supervision, order, control, and 12 full responsibility of a dentist licensed under this chapter and may practice:
- 13 (a) In a dental office, public or private school, health care facility, or government 14 institution with a dentist on staff;
- 15 (b) Without the physical presence of a supervising dentist as provided in 16 administrative regulations promulgated pursuant to subsections (6), (7), and 17 (8) of this section; or
- 18 (c) Without a supervising dentist if providing screening services in accordance 19 with subsection (9) of this section.

 21 manner that is separate or independent from the dental practice of a supervising
 22 dentist or to establish or maintain an office or practice that is primarily devoted to
 23 the provision of dental hygiene services.
- 24 (5) A dental hygienist may be employed by the supervising dentist or under contract 25 with a dentist licensed under this chapter who is one (1) of the following:

4	(9)	A c	lental hygienist may provide screening services in any setting without the

8		(b)	Patients are informed that the service being provided is a screening and that
9			only a dentist is licensed to make a definitive diagnosis of the need for denta
10			care.
