9		<u>(b)</u>	1. a. The salary schedule for coroners in subdivision b. of this
10			subparagraph provides for nine (9) levels of minimum salaries
11			based upon the population of the county in the year prior to the
12			election of the coroner. To implement the salary schedule, the
13			Department for Local Government shall, by November 1 of each
14			year preceding the election of the coroner, certify for each
15			county the population group applicable to each county based on
16			the most recent estimates of the United States Department of
17			Commerce, Bureau of the Census. The salary schedule shall
18			remain as determined by the Department for Local Government,
19			regardless of changes in the population estimates or the actual
20			census count that may occur during the term for which the
21			coroner has been elected or appointed.
22			b. i. The salary schedule provides four (4) steps for yearly
23			increments within each population group. A coroner's
24			salary shall be at a minimum equal to the amount stated for
25			the first step within the applicable population group for the
26			first year or portion thereof the coroner serves in office.
27			Thereafter, on January 1 of each subsequent year, the

9	(4)	(a)	The initial course of continuing education [required under subsection (1)(b) of
10			this section] shall consist of a forty (40) hour basic training course prescribed
11			by the Justice and Public Safety Cabinet. Annually thereafter the coroner shall
12			attend and successfully complete at least eighteen (18) hours of approved
13			training in order to be compensated in accordance with subsection
14			(1)(e)[(1)(b)] of this section.
15		(b)	Within three (3) years of initially assuming office, in order to be compensated
16			in accordance with subsections $(1)\underline{(e)}[(b)]$ and (2) of this section, a coroner or
17			deputy coroner shall attend and complete a course of at least four (4) hours
18			provided by the Department of Criminal Justice Training that shall include
19			instruction on the grieving process and best practices for providing a notice of
20			death to a spouse or next of kin and may include instruction on other similar
21			topics. A coroner or deputy coroner that has completed the course shall not be
22			required to retake the course.
23		<u>(c)</u> [(5)] If a deputy coroner assumes the office of coroner after receiving the
24			training stipulated in this <u>subsection</u> [section], the deputy coroner shall be
25			compensated in accordance with[the compensation schedule set forth in]
26			subsection (1) <u>(e)</u> [(b)] of this section.
27	<u>(5)</u> [((6)]	The number of deputy coroners in a county shall not exceed one (1) for each

twenty-five thousand (25,000) inhabitants, or fraction thereof, according to the most
recent federal census, but every coroner may, subject to the approval of the
legislative body of the county, consolidated local government, charter county
government, urban-county government, or unified local government, appoint
additional deputy coroners, regardless of population.
