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1		AN ACT relating to the protection of veterans' benefits.
2	Be it	enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 40 IS CREATED TO
4	REA	D AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1)	For the purposes of this section:
6		(a) "Compensation" means any money, thing of value, or economic benefit
7		<u>conferred on, or received by, any person in return for services rendered, or</u>
8		to be rendered, by himself or herself or another;
9		(b) "Person" means any natural person, corporation, trust, partnership,
10		incorporated or unincorporated association, or any other legal entity; and
11		(c) "Veterans' benefits matter" means the preparation, presentation, or
12		prosecution of any claim affecting any person who has filed or expressed an
13		intent to file a claim for any benefit, program, service, commodity, function,
14		status, or entitlement to which is determined to pertain to veterans, their
15		dependents, their survivors, or any other individual eligible for such
16		benefits under the laws and regulations administered by the United States
17		Department of Veterans Affairs or the Kentucky Department of Veterans'
18		<u>Affairs.</u>
19	<u>(2)</u>	No person shall receive any compensation for referring any individual to another
20		person to advise or assist the individual with any veterans' benefits matter.
21	<u>(3)</u>	No person shall receive any compensation for any services rendered in
22		connection with any claim filed within the one (1) year presumptive period of
23		active duty release.
24	<u>(4)</u>	A person seeking to receive compensation for advising, assisting, or consulting
25		any individual with any veterans' benefits matter shall, before rendering any
26		services, memorialize all terms regarding the individual's payment of fees for
27		services rendered in a written agreement signed by both parties that specifies:

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1	(a) No initial or nonrefundable fee shall be charged; and
2	(b) Fees for representation or assistance shall not include late fees or interest
3	and shall not exceed five (5) times the one (1) month increase in benefits,
4	not to exceed twelve thousand five hundred dollars (\$12,500).
5	(5) A person seeking to receive compensation for advising, assisting, or consulting
6	any individual with any veterans' benefits matter or engaging in the preparation
7	of an initial claim for a fee shall not:
8	(a) Utilize international call centers or data centers for processing any
9	veterans' personal information;
10	(b) Aggressively or directly solicit business regarding any veterans' benefit
11	matter; or
12	(c) Gain direct access to any personal medical, financial, or government
13	benefits log-in, username, or password information.
14	(6) A person seeking to receive compensation for advising, assisting, or consulting
15	any individual with any veterans' benefits matter may utilize an independent
16	medical professional for a medical exam but shall not utilize a medical
17	professional with whom they have an employment or business relationship.
18	(7) A person shall not advertise or guarantee, either directly or by implication, that
19	any individual is certain to receive specific veterans' benefits or that any
20	individual is certain to receive a specific level, percentage, or amount of veterans'
21	<u>benefits.</u>
22	(8) (a) A person shall not advise, assist, or consult for compensation any individual
23	concerning any veterans' benefits matter without clearly providing at the
24	outset of the business relationship the following disclosure both orally and
25	<u>in writing:</u>
26	"This business is not sponsored by, or affiliated with, the United States
27	Department of Veterans Affairs or the Kentucky Department of Veterans'

1	Affairs, or any other federally chartered veterans' service organization.
2	Other organizations, including but not limited to the Kentucky Department
3	of Veterans' Affairs, a local veterans' service organization, and other
4	federally chartered veterans' service organizations may be able to provide
5	you with this service free of charge. Products or services offered by this
6	business are not necessarily endorsed by any of these organizations. You
7	may qualify for other veterans' benefits beyond the benefits for which you
8	are receiving services here."
9	(b) The written disclosure in paragraph (a) of this subsection shall appear in at
10	least twelve (12) point font and shall appear in a readily noticeable and
11	identifiable place in the person's agreement with the individual seeking
12	services. The individual shall verbally acknowledge understanding of the
13	oral disclosure and sign the document in which the written disclosure
14	appears to represent understanding of these provisions. The person offering
15	services shall retain a copy of the written disclosure while providing
16	veterans' benefits services for compensation to the individual and for at
17	least one (1) year after the date on which the service relations terminate.
18	(9) A violation of this section shall constitute an unfair, false, misleading, or
19	deceptive act or practice in the conduct of trade or commerce under KRS 367.170.
20	(10) Notwithstanding this section, an attorney or law firm seeking to receive
21	compensation for advising, assisting, or consulting any individual with any
22	veterans' benefits matter shall be governed by the limitations set forth in 38
23	<u>C.F.R. sec. 14.636.</u>
