1	A RESOLUTION recognizing September 21 to 28, 2025, as Frontotemporal
2	Degeneration Awareness Week.
3	WHEREAS, frontotemporal degeneration (FTD) is an incurable and terminal
4	neurodegenerative disease that affects the frontal and temporal lobes, causing
5	impairments to speech, personality, behavior, and motor skills; and
6	WHEREAS, more than 60,000 Americans are estimated to be affected by FTD; and
7	WHEREAS, though the disease may strike individuals between the age of 21 and
8	80, the highest percentage of those afflicted are between the age of 45 and 64; and
9	WHEREAS, FTD is the most common form of dementia affecting individuals
10	younger than 60 years of age; and
11	WHEREAS, although FTD is now better diagnosed, those afflicted with FTD may
12	still wait well over three years from the onset of symptoms to receive a definitive
13	diagnosis by a specialized physician; and
14	WHEREAS, FTD has often previously been misdiagnosed as a psychiatric disorder
15	or neurodegenerative disease because FTD's wide range of cognitive and behavioral
16	symptoms manifest themselves at a fairly young age; and
17	WHEREAS, in the behavioral variant of FTD, a person's sense of social graces and
18	appropriate behavior can be lost, and their personality may be significantly changed; and
19	WHEREAS, in the language variant of FTD, primary progressive aphasia, a person
20	may have trouble producing speech and understanding grammar, lose the meaning of
21	words, or become hesitant in their speech, and may eventually become mute; and
22	WHEREAS, in the movement variant of FTD, a person may experience muscle
23	weakness, falling, loss of balance, difficulty making speech, difficulty swallowing, or
24	choking; and
25	WHEREAS, FTD affects a person's ability to express emotion, show affection,
26	speak, maintain muscle strength, and swallow and, in sum, has a devastating impact on
27	the entire personality, rendering individuals in the prime of life unable to live a normal

- life or maintain a livelihood; and
- WHEREAS, the economic burden of FTD is estimated to be twice that required for
- 3 individuals with the better-known Alzheimer's Disease; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the Association for Frontotemporal Degeneration is the leading
- 5 association advocating for increased awareness of the nature and effects of FTD and is
- 6 exclusively focused on the spectrum of FTD disorders with a mission to improve the
- 7 quality of life of people affected by FTD and drive research to a cure; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Frontotemporal Degeneration Awareness Week provides an
- 9 opportunity for all Kentuckians to learn more about this singular form of dementia,
- support research into treatments and a cure, and offer comfort to those who have been
- 11 affected by the disease; and
- WHEREAS, it is imperative that there be greater awareness of this serious disease,
- and more must be done to increase education and research at the local, state, and national
- 14 levels;
