 (3) A valid, unexpired passport from his or her country of origin, along with one (1)
 of the following documents issued by the United States Department of Homeland
 Security, United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services:
- 6 (a) Form I-94, Arrival/Departure Record number;
- 7 (b) Form I-766, Employment Authorization Document number; or
- 8 (c) Form I-797, Notice of Action receipt number;
- 9 *if he or she is an applicant as defined in subsection (1) (b) of section 2 of this Act.*
- 10 \rightarrow Section 7. This Act takes effect July 1, 2025.
