KENTUCKY GENERAL ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT FORM

Amend printed copy of **SB 45**

On page 1, line 19, remove brackets and strikethrough from "[or]"; and

On page 1, lines 19 and 20, delete "; or any activity that has historically involved the utilization of working animals"; and

On page 2, line 5, remove brackets and strikethrough from "[and]"; and

On page 2, line 7, delete "; and"; and

On page 2, lines 8 to 11, delete all underlined material; and

On page 2, lines 12 to 24, delete Section 2 in its entirety and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"→ SECTION 2. A NEW SECTION OF KRS 247.800 TO 247.810 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

**(1) A city, town, county, or other political subdivision of the Commonwealth shall not adopt any ordinance, resolution, rule, or regulation restricting a person from engaging in an agritourism activity so long as the agritourism activity complies with public health and safety and planning and zoning requirements or any other existing law enforceable by the recognized police powers of a local government. Local legislation in violation of this section shall be void and unenforceable.**

**(2) Any ordinance, resolution, rule, or regulation enacted prior to the effective date of this Act and containing a restriction described in subsection (1) of this section shall remain**

- (3) This section shall not restrict a city, town, county, or other political subdivision from adopting or enforcing an ordinance, resolution, rule, or regulation requiring an agritourism activity to comply with any established minimum standards.
- (4) An agritourism activity shall not include dog fighting as defined in KRS 525.125 or animal fighting as referenced in 21 U.S.C. sec. 2156.".
