

1 AN ACT relating to the Kentucky Communications Network Authority and
2 declaring an emergency.

3 ***Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

4 ➔Section 1. KRS 154.15-010 is amended to read as follows:

5 As used in this subchapter:

6 (1) "Authority" means the Kentucky Communications Network Authority;

7 (2) "Board" means the Board of the Kentucky Communications Network Authority;

8 (3) ~~"Executive director" means the executive director of the Kentucky Communications~~
9 ~~Network Authority;~~

10 (4) "Network" or "KentuckyWired" means the Commonwealth's open-access
11 broadband network; and

12 (4) ~~(5)~~ "Partnership" means the public-private partnership entered into between the
13 Commonwealth and a private entity or entities for the purpose of creating, running,
14 and maintaining the network.

15 ➔Section 2. KRS 154.15-020 is amended to read as follows:

16 (1) The Kentucky Communications Network Authority is established and shall be
17 attached to the Finance and Administration Cabinet for administrative
18 ~~Office of the Governor. The authority shall be headed by an executive~~
19 ~~director who shall be hired by the board and approved by the Governor.~~

20 (2) ~~[Notwithstanding KRS 42.726,]~~The duties of the authority shall be to:

21 (a) Oversee and maintain KentuckyWired, the Commonwealth's open-access
22 broadband network;

23 (b) Manage the master agreement establishing the public-private partnership
24 between the Commonwealth and its private industry partner or partners. The
25 purpose of the agreement is to design, engineer, build, operate, maintain, and
26 upgrade the network;

27 (c) Provide network connectivity to public agencies;

- (d) Offer access to entities eligible to utilize excess capacity on the network;
- (e) Manage other aspects of the network and its utilization ~~through the executive director and~~ with oversight and input from the board established in KRS 154.15-030 ~~and the advisory group established in this section~~;
- (f) Promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with ~~pursuant to~~ KRS Chapter 13A necessary to implement the purposes of this subchapter;
- (g) Enter into contracts with public and private entities to carry out its duties and responsibilities. A contract or other agreement involving the acquisition or disposition of a property interest by the Commonwealth shall be signed by the secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet. KRS Chapters 45A and 56 may require the secretary's signature on other contracts or agreements;
- (h) Provide program management services ensuring the financial viability of the master agreement and related contracts and agreements, including grant administration, contract compliance and oversight, community planning support, and constituent services; and
- (i) Seek out, secure, and manage funding sources for the network ~~; and~~
- (j) ~~Create an advisory group, including major stakeholders, to provide input and feedback on issues important to the user community and to the long term sustainability of the project and the network. The advisory group shall be administratively attached to and managed by the authority. The advisory group shall include but not be limited to representatives of:~~
 1. ~~The Department of Education;~~
 2. ~~The Council on Postsecondary Education;~~
 3. ~~The Cabinet for Economic Development;~~
 4. ~~The Cabinet for Health and Family Services;~~
 5. ~~The Transportation Cabinet;~~

10 (3) **The executive director of the Commonwealth Office of Technology established in KRS 42.724 shall assign personnel employed with the Commonwealth Office of Technology to carry out the functions and responsibilities of the authority** [With the approval of the board, the executive director may hire additional officers and other personnel necessary for the proper functioning of the authority, fix their salaries, and prescribe their duties. The executive director and persons employed by the authority shall not be subject to the provisions of KRS Chapter 18A].

17 (4) (a) With the approval of the board, the executive director **of the Commonwealth Office of Technology** may make, execute, and effectuate contracts, leveraging future revenues from provision of government-to-government services and sale or lease of excess capacity, to incur debt in the name of the authority and enter into financing agreements with the Commonwealth, agencies of the Commonwealth, lending institutions, investors, or investing entities.

23 (b) The total amount of debt or financing under this subsection shall not exceed one hundred ten million dollars (\$110,000,000), and shall not leverage any future revenues committed to the repayment of any other debt, or expected to be used for the repayment of any other debt, as of the time the debt or financing is entered into.

1 (c) Any proposed debt or financing under this subsection shall be submitted to the
2 Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee for review at least fourteen
3 (14) days prior to the committee meeting.

4 (d) If any debt or financing is incurred under this subsection, the authority shall
5 provide to the Legislative Research Commission:

6 1. Within thirty (30) days of entering into a debt or financing agreement, a
7 copy of the agreement; and

8 2. On January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1 of each year that the debt
9 or financing is outstanding:

10 a. The amount of principal and interest remaining on the debt or
11 financing;

12 b. The use to which the capital gained from the debt or financing has
13 been put; and

14 c. Any amendments, if any, to the original debt or financing
15 instruments or agreements.

16 ➔Section 3. KRS 154.15-030 is amended to read as follows:

17 (1) The Board of the Kentucky Communications Network Authority is established. The
18 board shall be attached administratively to the Finance and Administration
19 Cabinet[Office of the Governor].

20 (2) The board shall consist of:

21 (a) The chief information officer of the Department of Education[secretary of
22 the Governor's Executive Cabinet] or designee, who shall serve as chair of the
23 board;

24 (b) Two (2) members designated by the Governor as follows:

25 1. One (1) member selected from a list of three (3) nominees submitted
26 by the Kentucky League of Cities; and

27 2. One (1) member selected from a list of three (3) nominees submitted

by the Kentucky Association of Counties [The state budget director or designee;

(e) The secretary of the Transportation Cabinet or designee;

(c) The Commissioner of Agriculture [secretary of the Cabinet for Economic Development] or designee;

(d)(e) The Secretary of State[the Justice and Public Safety Cabinet] or designee:

(e)[(f)] The Treasurer[commissioner of the Department for Local Government]
or designee; and

(f) [REDACTED] A representative designated by the Center for Rural Development.

11 (3) The duties of the board shall be to:

(a) Develop and implement a strategic plan for and provide policy direction to the authority:

(b) Review performance reports from the partners named in the master agreement regarding deployment, operations, and administration of the network and its compliance with service level agreements with the Commonwealth;

(c) Monitor the results achieved through the partnership's strategy to develop new revenue streams and expand network usage through marketing and awareness programs;

(d) Approve fiscal planning for the authority including budget development, state appropriations management, cost-recovery schedules, grant administration, and billing services;

(e) Establish rates for services offered through the network and establish methods for customer account management; and

(f) Direct upgrades to technology as necessary.

26 (4) The board shall meet at least semiannually and at other times upon the call of the
27 chair.

1 (5) The board may form committees or other subgroups as necessary to accomplish its
2 duties and functions.

3 ➔Section 4. KRS 42.014 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1) There is established within the cabinet the:

5 (a) Office of the Secretary;

6 (b) Commonwealth Office of Technology~~H~~ and the Office of the Controller, each
7 of which shall be headed by an executive director appointed by the secretary
8 with the approval of the Governor;

9 (c) **Kentucky Communications Network Authority established in Section 2 of**
10 **this Act and headed by the executive director of the Commonwealth Office**
11 **of Technology;**

12 (d) **Board of the Kentucky Communications Network Authority established in**
13 **Section 3 of this Act;** and

14 (e)~~(e)~~ Department of Revenue and the Department for Facilities and Support
15 Services, each of which shall be headed by a commissioner appointed by the
16 secretary, upon the approval of the Governor, and responsible to the secretary.
17 Each of these departments may have at least one (1) major assistant not in the

24 (3) All appointments under this chapter to positions not in the classified service shall be
25 made pursuant to KRS 12.050, and such appointees shall be major assistants to the
26 secretary and shall assist in the development of policy.

27 ➔Section 5. KRS 42.726 is amended to read as follows:

- 1 (1) The Commonwealth Office of Technology shall be the lead organizational entity
2 within the executive branch regarding delivery of information technology services,
3 including application development and delivery, and shall serve as the single
4 information technology authority for the Commonwealth.
- 5 (2) The roles and duties of the Commonwealth Office of Technology shall include but
6 not be limited to:
 - 7 (a) Providing technical support and services to all executive agencies of state
8 government in the application of information technology;
 - 9 (b) Assuring compatibility and connectivity of Kentucky's information systems;
 - 10 (c) Developing strategies and policies to support and promote the effective
11 applications of information technology within state government as a means of
12 saving money, increasing employee productivity, and improving state services
13 to the public, including electronic public access to information of the
14 Commonwealth;
 - 15 (d) Developing, implementing, and managing strategic information technology
16 directions, standards, and enterprise architecture, including implementing
17 necessary management processes to ensure full compliance with those
18 directions, standards, and architecture;
 - 19 (e) Promoting effective and efficient design and operation of all major
20 information resources management processes for executive branch agencies,
21 including improvements to work processes;
 - 22 (f) Developing, implementing, and maintaining the technology infrastructure of
23 the Commonwealth and all related support staff, planning, administration,
24 asset management, and procurement for all executive branch cabinets and
25 agencies except:
 - 26 1. Agencies led by a statewide elected official;
 - 27 2. The nine (9) public institutions of postsecondary education;

- 1 3. The Department of Education's services provided to local school
- 2 districts;
- 3 4. The Kentucky Retirement Systems, the County Employees Retirement
- 4 System, the Kentucky Public Pensions Authority, and the Teachers'
- 5 Retirement System;
- 6 5. The Kentucky Housing Corporation;
- 7 6. The Kentucky Lottery Corporation;
- 8 7. The Kentucky Higher Education Student Loan Corporation; and
- 9 8. The Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority;
- 10 (g) Facilitating and fostering applied research in emerging technologies that offer
- 11 the Commonwealth innovative business solutions;
- 12 (h) Reviewing and overseeing large or complex information technology projects
- 13 and systems for compliance with statewide strategies, policies, and standards,
- 14 including alignment with the Commonwealth's business goals, investment,
- 15 and other risk management policies. The executive director is authorized to
- 16 grant or withhold approval to initiate these projects;
- 17 (i) Integrating information technology resources to provide effective and
- 18 supportable information technology applications in the Commonwealth;
- 19 (j) Establishing the central statewide geographic information clearinghouse to
- 20 maintain map inventories, information on current and planned geographic
- 21 information systems applications, information on grants available for the
- 22 acquisition or enhancement of geographic information resources, and a
- 23 directory of geographic information resources available within the state or
- 24 from the federal government;
- 25 (k) Coordinating multiagency information technology projects, including
- 26 overseeing the development and maintenance of statewide base maps and
- 27 geographic information systems;

- 1 (l) Providing access to both consulting and technical assistance, and education
2 and training, on the application and use of information technologies to state
3 and local agencies;
- 4 (m) In cooperation with other agencies, evaluating, participating in pilot studies,
5 and making recommendations on information technology hardware and
6 software;
- 7 (n) Providing staff support and technical assistance to the Geographic
8 Information Advisory Council and the Kentucky Information Technology
9 Advisory Council;
- 10 (o) Overseeing the development of a statewide geographic information plan with
11 input from the Geographic Information Advisory Council;
- 12 (p) Developing for state executive branch agencies a coordinated security
13 framework and model governance structure relating to the privacy and
14 confidentiality of personal information collected and stored by state executive
15 branch agencies, including but not limited to:
 - 16 1. Identification of key infrastructure components and how to secure them;
 - 17 2. Establishment of a common benchmark that measures the effectiveness
18 of security, including continuous monitoring and automation of
19 defenses;
 - 20 3. Implementation of vulnerability scanning and other security
21 assessments;
 - 22 4. Provision of training, orientation programs, and other communications
23 that increase awareness of the importance of security among agency
24 employees responsible for personal information; and
 - 25 5. Development of and making available a cyber security incident response
26 plan and procedure;
- 27 (q) Establishing, publishing, maintaining, and implementing comprehensive

1 policy standards and procedures for the responsible, ethical, and transparent
2 use of generative artificial intelligence systems and high-risk artificial
3 intelligence systems by departments, agencies, and administrative bodies,
4 including but not limited to policy standards and procedures that:

5 1. Govern their procurement, implementation, and ongoing assessment;
6 2. Address and provide resources for security of data and privacy; and
7 3. Create guidelines for acceptable use policies for integrating high-risk
8 artificial intelligence systems;~~and~~

9 (r) Preparing proposed legislation and funding proposals for the General
10 Assembly that will further solidify coordination and expedite implementation
11 of information technology systems; and

12 (s) Carrying out the functions and responsibilities of the Kentucky
13 Communications Network Authority established in Section 2 of this Act.

14 (3) The Commonwealth Office of Technology may:

15 (a) Provide general consulting services, technical training, and support for
16 generic software applications, upon request from a local government, if the
17 executive director finds that the requested services can be rendered within the
18 established terms of the federally approved cost allocation plan;

19 (b) Promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A
20 necessary for the implementation of KRS 42.720 to 42.742, 45.253, 171.420,
21 186A.040, and 186A.285;

22 (c) Solicit, receive, and consider proposals from any state agency, federal agency,
23 local government, university, nonprofit organization, private person, or
24 corporation;

25 (d) Solicit and accept money by grant, gift, donation, bequest, legislative
26 appropriation, or other conveyance to be held, used, and applied in accordance
27 with KRS 42.720 to 42.742, 45.253, 171.420, 186A.040, and 186A.285;

1 (e) Make and enter into memoranda of agreement and contracts necessary or
2 incidental to the performance of duties and execution of its powers, including
3 but not limited to agreements or contracts with the United States, other state
4 agencies, and any governmental subdivision of the Commonwealth;

5 (f) Accept grants from the United States government and its agencies and
6 instrumentalities, and from any source, other than any person, firm, or
7 corporation, or any director, officer, or agent thereof that manufactures or
8 sells information resources technology equipment, goods, or services. To
9 these ends, the Commonwealth Office of Technology shall have the power to
10 comply with those conditions and execute those agreements that are
11 necessary, convenient, or desirable; and

12 (g) Purchase interest in contractual services, rentals of all types, supplies,
13 materials, equipment, and other services to be used in the research and
14 development of beneficial applications of information resources technologies.
15 Competitive bids may not be required for:
16 1. New and emerging technologies as approved by the executive director
17 or her or his designee; or
18 2. Related professional, technical, or scientific services, but contracts shall
19 be submitted in accordance with KRS 45A.690 to 45A.725.

20 (4) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter or diminish the provisions of KRS
21 171.410 to 171.740 or the authority conveyed by these statutes to the Archives and
22 Records Commission and the Department for Libraries and Archives.

23 (5) The Commonwealth Office of Technology shall, on or before October 1 of each
24 year, submit to the Legislative Research Commission a report in accordance with
25 KRS 57.390 detailing:
26 (a) Any security breaches that occurred within organizational units of the
27 executive branch of state government during the prior fiscal year that required

1 notification to the Commonwealth Office of Technology under KRS 61.932;

2 (b) Actions taken to resolve the security breach, and to prevent additional security

3 breaches in the future;

4 (c) A general description of what actions are taken as a matter of course to protect

5 personal data from security breaches; and

6 (d) Any quantifiable financial impact to the agency reporting a security breach.

8 (1) There is hereby created the Kentucky Information Technology Advisory Council to:

9 (a) Advise the executive director of the Commonwealth Office of Technology on

10 approaches to coordinating information technology solutions among libraries,

11 public schools, local governments, universities, and other public entities;

12 (b) Advise the executive director of the Commonwealth Office of Technology on

13 coordination among and across the organizational units of the executive

14 branch of state government to prepare for, respond to, and prevent attacks;

15 and

16 (c) Provide a forum for the discussion of emerging technologies that enhance

17 electronic accessibility to various publicly funded sources of information and

18 services.

19 (2) The Kentucky Information Technology Advisory Council shall consist of:

20 (a) The state budget director or a designee;

21 (b) The state librarian or a designee;

22 (c) One (1) representative from the public universities to be appointed by the

23 Governor from a list of three (3) persons submitted by the Council on

24 Postsecondary Education;

25 (d) Three (3) citizen members from the private sector with information

26 technology knowledge and experience appointed by the Governor;

27 (e) Two (2) representatives of local government appointed by the Governor;

1 (f) One (1) representative from the area development districts appointed by the
2 Governor from a list of names submitted by the executive directors of the area
3 development districts;

4 (g) One (1) member of the media appointed by the Governor;

5 (h) The executive director of the Kentucky Authority for Educational Television;

6 (i) The chair of the Public Service Commission or a designee;

7 (j) Two (2) members of the Kentucky General Assembly, one (1) from each
8 chamber, selected by the Legislative Research Commission;

21 organization having the same responsibilities and purposes shall be the nominating

24 and necessary expenses in accordance with travel and subsistence requirements
25 established by the Finance and Administration Cabinet.

7 the Kentucky Communications Network Authority established in Section 2 of this Act

9 employed by the Commonwealth Office of Technology under the direction of the
10 executive director of the Commonwealth Office of Technology. All records, files, and

22 declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor
23 or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
