

1 AN ACT relating to executive branch agencies.

2 ***Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

3 ➔Section 1. KRS 148.280 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1) The commission:

5 (a) Shall have the authority and control of such property as now is under its  
6 custody and control, and of such property as may hereafter be placed under its  
7 control or transferred to it by the State Property and Buildings Commission,  
8 for any purpose mentioned in this section;

9 (b) May erect and repair buildings on the Kentucky Horse Park and make any and  
10 all necessary or proper improvements, and generally carry on a program of  
11 development and extension of facilities designed to accomplish the objectives  
12 defined in this section; and

13 (c) Shall promote the progress of the state and stimulate public interest in the  
14 advancement and development of the state by providing the facilities of the  
15 Kentucky Horse Park for exhibitionary, competitive, and other events relative  
16 to various aspects of the horse industry and other functions calculated to  
17 advance and enhance the tourist industry, economy, entertainment, cultural,  
18 and educational interests of the public.

19 (2) The commission may take, acquire, and hold property, and all interest herein, by  
20 deed, gift, devise, bequest, lease, or by transfer from the state property so acquired  
21 in the manner provided by law, and may dispose of any property so acquired in the  
22 manner provided by law.

23 (3) The commission may promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with  
24 KRS Chapter 13A to govern the operation, maintenance, or use of property under  
25 its custody and control, as are necessary to:

26 (a) Maintain decency and good order;

27 (b) Protect the peace or safety of the general public;

- 1 (c) Protect the public interest, convenience, or necessity;~~and~~
- 2 (d) Govern the operation, maintenance, or use of the Kentucky Horse Park; and
- 3 (e) Exercise the authority granted in subsection (4)(d) of this section.
- 4 (4) The commission may:
- 5 (a) Employ or contract with other persons, firms, or corporations the commission
- 6 may deem necessary or desirable to accomplish its duties and functions; may
- 7 fix the compensation and the terms of employment or contract of those
- 8 employed or contracted with; and may assign to them duties and
- 9 responsibilities the commission may determine, including the responsibility of
- 10 actual operation of any or all of the facilities under the control of the
- 11 commission;
- 12 (b) Purchase liability insurance for the members and executive officers exempted
- 13 from the classified service of the state by KRS 18A.115;~~and~~
- 14 (c) Operate shows and expositions that support the purpose and function of the
- 15 Kentucky Horse Park; and
- 16 (d) Through the president, eject or exclude from Kentucky Horse Park property
- 17 any person who engages or has engaged in conduct that would negatively
- 18 impact the safety and security of park attendees.

19 ➔Section 2. KRS 42.740 is amended to read as follows:

- 20 (1) There is hereby established a Geographic Information Advisory Council, attached
- 21 to the Commonwealth Office of Technology for administrative purposes, to advise
- 22 the executive director of the Commonwealth Office of Technology on issues
- 23 relating to geographic information and geographic information systems.
- 24 (2) The council shall recommend policies and procedures that assist state and local
- 25 jurisdictions in developing, deploying, and leveraging geographic information
- 26 resources and geographic information systems technology for the purpose of
- 27 improving public administration.

- 1 (3) The council shall closely coordinate with users of geographic information systems  
2 to recommend policies and procedures that ensure the maximum use of geographic  
3 information by minimizing the redundancy of geographic information and  
4 geographic information resources, as well as to ensure that the geographic  
5 information clearinghouse maintained by the Division of Geographic Information  
6 Systems meets the needs of all state agencies.
- 7 (4) (a) The Geographic Information Advisory Council shall consist of twenty-five  
8 (25) members and one (1) legislative liaison. The members shall be  
9 knowledgeable in the use and application of geographic information systems  
10 technology and shall have sufficient authority within their organizations to  
11 influence the implementation of council recommendations.
- 12 (b) The council shall consist of:
- 13 1. The secretary of the Transportation Cabinet or his or her designee;
  - 14 2. The secretary of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services or his or  
15 her designee;
  - 16 3. The director of the Kentucky Geological Survey or his or her designee;
  - 17 4. The secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or his or her  
18 designee;
  - 19 5. The executive director of the Commonwealth Office of Technology or  
20 her or his designee, who shall serve as chair;
  - 21 6. The secretary of the Economic Development Cabinet or his or her  
22 designee;
  - 23 7. The commissioner of the Department for Local Government or his or  
24 her designee;
  - 25 8. The secretary of the Justice and Public Safety Cabinet or his or her  
26 designee;
  - 27 9. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)

- 1 persons submitted by the president of the Council on Postsecondary  
2 Education;
- 3 10. The adjutant general of the Department of Military Affairs or his or her  
4 designee;
- 5 11. The commissioner of the Department of Education or his or her  
6 designee;
- 7 12. The secretary of the Energy and Environment Cabinet or his or her  
8 designee;
- 9 13. The Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture or his or her  
10 designee;
- 11 14. The secretary of the Tourism, Arts and Heritage Cabinet or his or her  
12 designee;
- 13 15. The executive director of the Office of Property Valuation or his or her  
14 designee;
- 15 16. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)~~six~~  
16 ~~(6)~~ persons submitted by the president of the Kentucky League of  
17 Cities;
- 18 17. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)~~six~~  
19 ~~(6)~~ persons submitted by the president of the Kentucky Association of  
20 Counties;
- 21 18. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)  
22 persons submitted by the president of the Kentucky Chapter of the  
23 American Planning Association;
- 24 19. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)  
25 persons submitted by the president of the Kentucky Association of  
26 Professional Surveyors;
- 27 20. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)

- 1 persons submitted by the president of the Kentucky Society of  
2 Professional Engineers;
- 3 21. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)  
4 persons submitted by the chairman of the Kentucky Board of Registered  
5 Geologists;
- 6 22. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)  
7 persons submitted by the president of the Council of Area Development  
8 Districts;
- 9 23. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)  
10 persons submitted by the president of the Kentucky Association of  
11 Mapping Professionals;
- 12 24. One (1) member appointed by the Governor from a list of three (3)  
13 persons submitted by the executive director of the Kentucky Property  
14 Valuation Administrators Association; and
- 15 25. The executive director of the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security.
- 16 (c) The council shall have one (1) nonvoting legislative liaison, to be appointed  
17 by the Legislative Research Commission.
- 18 (5) The council may have committees and subcommittees as determined by the council  
19 or an executive committee, if an executive committee exists.
- 20 (6) A member of the council shall not:
- 21 (a) Be an officer, employee, or paid consultant of a business entity that has, or of  
22 a trade association for business entities that have, a substantial interest in the  
23 geographic information industry and is doing business in the Commonwealth;
- 24 (b) Own, control, or have, directly or indirectly, more than ten percent (10%)  
25 interest in a business entity that has a substantial interest in the geographic  
26 information industry;
- 27 (c) Be in any manner connected with any contract or bid for furnishing any

- 1 governmental body of the Commonwealth with geographic information  
2 systems, the computers on which they are automated, or a service related to  
3 geographic information systems;
- 4 (d) Be a person required to register as a lobbyist because of activities for  
5 compensation on behalf of a business entity that has, or on behalf of a trade  
6 association of business entities that have, substantial interest in the geographic  
7 information industry;
- 8 (e) Accept or receive money or another thing of value from an individual, firm, or  
9 corporation to whom a contract may be awarded, directly or indirectly, by  
10 rebate, gift, or otherwise; or
- 11 (f) Be liable to civil action or any action performed in good faith in the  
12 performance of duties as a council member.
- 13 (7) Those council members specified in subsection (4)~~(a)~~<sup>(b)</sup> of this section who serve  
14 by virtue of an office shall serve on the board while they hold that office.
- 15 (8) Appointed members of the council shall serve for a term of four (4) years.  
16 Vacancies in the membership of the council shall be filled in the same manner as  
17 the original appointments. If a nominating organization changes its name, its  
18 successor organization having the same responsibilities and purposes shall be the  
19 nominating organization.
- 20 (9) The council shall have no funds of its own, and council members shall not receive  
21 compensation of any kind from the council.
- 22 (10) A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.  
23 Members' designees shall have voting privileges at council meetings.
