

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION designating honorary names for various roads and  
2 bridges.

3 WHEREAS, from time to time, the General Assembly has seen fit to honor various  
4 Kentuckians by naming portions of state highways and erecting commemorative roadway  
5 signs in their honor; and

6 WHEREAS, these Kentuckians have come from all walks of life, held a multitude  
7 of jobs, and had a variety of accomplishments that made them deserving of the honor;  
8 and

9 WHEREAS, these individuals have included former Governors, former members of  
10 the General Assembly, decorated veterans, slain law enforcement officers, local elected  
11 officials, astronauts, doctors, educators, distinguished athletes, and civic leaders; and

12 WHEREAS, every citizen of the Commonwealth owes a great debt of gratitude to  
13 the patriotic men and women killed and wounded in service to their country in times of  
14 great need; and

15 WHEREAS, the General Assembly has often honored the veterans of this state by  
16 naming portions of several roads, from interstates to small two-lane country roads, in  
17 their honor; and

18 WHEREAS, the General Assembly again sees fit to honor a group of individuals  
19 who have made the lives of their fellow Kentuckians better and brought honor and  
20 respect to the Commonwealth;

21 NOW, THEREFORE,

22 ***Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

23 ➔Section 1. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate United States Route 60A  
24 in Jefferson County, from the intersection with Kentucky Route 61 (mile point 4.547) to  
25 the intersection with Kentucky Route 864 (mile point 5.520), as the "Officer Peter  
26 Grignon Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the effective date of this  
27 Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this designation.



1 Egelston Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the effective date of this  
2 Resolution, erect appropriate signage denoting this designation.

3 ➔Section 8. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate a portion of Kentucky  
4 Route 1635 in Magoffin County, from mile point 3.65 to mile point 4.22, as the "Private  
5 Hargis Salyer, Jr. Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the effective date of  
6 this Resolution, erect appropriate signage denoting this designation.

7 ➔Section 9. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate a portion of Kentucky  
8 Route 84 in Marion County, from the intersection with Kentucky Route 527 and  
9 Broadway Street (mile point 5.25) to the intersection with Sallie Ray Pike (mile point  
10 7.269), as the "Lt. Brian Hatt Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the  
11 effective date of this Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this designation.

12 ➔Section 10. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate Kentucky Route 2428 in  
13 Harlan County as the "Bill Howard, Sr. Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of  
14 the effective date of this Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this designation.

15 ➔Section 11. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate Kentucky Route 3690 in  
16 Henderson County as the "Joel Ray Hopper Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30  
17 days of the effective date of this Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this  
18 designation.

19 ➔Section 12. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate the overpass on  
20 Interstate 264 in Jefferson County, over Muhammad Ali Boulevard, as the "Rev. Dr.  
21 James A. Crumlin Memorial Overpass" and shall, within 30 days of the effective date of  
22 this Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this designation.

23 ➔Section 13. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate Kentucky Route 1120 in  
24 Kenton County, from the intersection with Madison Avenue (mile point 0.612) to the  
25 intersection with Scott Street (mile point 0.702), as the "Oakley Farris Memorial  
26 Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the effective date of this Resolution, erect  
27 appropriate signs denoting this designation.

1           ➔Section 14. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate Kentucky Route 406 in  
2 Leslie County, from the intersection with Mason Hollow Road (mile point 9.076) to the  
3 intersection with Grassy Branch Road (mile point 10.805), as the "Edmond Osborne  
4 Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the effective date of this Resolution,  
5 erect appropriate signs denoting this designation.

6           ➔Section 15. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate Kentucky Route 3535 in  
7 Green County as the "William C. 'Bill' Patterson Memorial Highway" and shall, within  
8 30 days of the effective date of this Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this  
9 designation.

10          ➔Section 16. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate Kentucky Route 55 in  
11 Marion County, from the intersection with United States Route 68 (mile point 0) to the  
12 intersection with Kentucky route 2154 (mile point 1.614), as the "Marion County Purple  
13 Heart Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the effective date of this  
14 Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this designation.

15          ➔Section 17. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate the bridge currently  
16 under construction on Kentucky Route 289 in Marion County over Rolling Fork at mile  
17 point 2.84 as the "Marion County Veterans Memorial Bridge" and shall, within 30 days  
18 of the completion of the bridge's construction, erect appropriate signs denoting this  
19 designation.

20          ➔Section 18. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate the bridge on Kentucky  
21 Route 295 over Livingston Creek at the Lyon/Crittenden County line (Bridge ID#  
22 072B00061N) as the "Andrea K. LeFan Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of  
23 the effective date of this Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this designation.

24          ➔Section 19. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate United States Route 23  
25 in Pike County, from the intersection with Kentucky Route 3524 (mile point 3.344) to the  
26 intersection with Dorton Creek Road (mile point 4.992), as the "Jerry Keith McPeek, Sr.  
27 and Patricia Lou McPeek Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the effective

1 date of this Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this designation. This  
2 designation shall supersede any previous honorary designation for this section of United  
3 States Route 23.

4       ➔Section 20. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate United State Route 119  
5 in Pike County, from mile point 18.72 to mile point 22.5, as the "Sheriff Charles E.  
6 'Fuzzy' Keese Memorial Highway" and from mile point 22.5 to mile point 25.648, as the  
7 "Coach Phillip Haywood Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the effective  
8 date of this Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting these designations. These  
9 designations shall supersede any previous honorary designation for these sections of  
10 United States Route 119.
