

1 A RESOLUTION recognizing February 11, 2026, as Recovery Advocacy Day in
2 the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

3 WHEREAS, Kentucky has been devastated by overdose deaths due to opioid use
4 and other substance use disorders; and

5 WHEREAS, in 2024, 1,410 Kentuckians passed away from preventable opioid
6 overdose, a 30.2% decrease from 2023; and

7 WHEREAS, Kentucky has been a leader in many areas aiming to preserve and
8 protect life, including expanding overdose prevention services and launching the
9 Advisory Council for Recovery Ready Communities project in 2022, that has since
10 certified 35 counties across the Commonwealth; and

11 WHEREAS, the people of Kentucky continue to suffer from a lack of resources,
12 including access to recovery and harm reduction services that support and foster
13 recovery; and

14 WHEREAS, the lives and experiences of those living in long-term recovery should
15 be celebrated; and

16 WHEREAS, a renewed resolve to aid, support, and protect those impacted by the
17 lives that have been lost as well as those in recovery is needed; and

18 WHEREAS, members of the Senate encourage the citizens of the Commonwealth
19 to help break the stigma that has plagued people suffering from substance use disorders,
20 and encourage them to share their stories of resilience and perseverance;

21 NOW, THEREFORE,

22 ***Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of***
23 ***Kentucky:***

24 ➔Section 1. The members of the Senate do hereby recognize February 11, 2026,
25 as Recovery Advocacy Day in Kentucky.

26 ➔Section 2. When the Senate adjourns this day, it does so in honor, recognition,
27 and celebration of Kentuckians living in long-term recovery and of those providing
