**MEASURE'S PURPOSE:** The purpose of the measure is to require each school building to have an automated external defibrillator, or AED, on hand, and to ensure that adequate staff at the school know how to use it.

**PROVISIONS/MECHANICS:** Section 1 amends KRS 158.612 to require each school council, or, if there is no school council, the principal in each building to obtain an AED by the 2019-2020 academic year. It also requires the council or principal to adopt procedures for its use in an emergency, adopt policies to comply with statutes regarding users of AEDs, and ensure that at least three employees are trained in its use.

Section 2 amends KRS 158.302 to conform by deleting language stating that AEDs are not required in all schools.

**FISCAL EXPLANATION:** This legislation has no fiscal impact on state funds, because it only requires action at the local level.
