Part II: Purpose and Mechanics
HB 259 protects property used for the production of handmade goods such as pottery, textiles and other items from undue regulation. The bill would establish such activity as an agricultural use if, (1) the item is produced on a tract of land that is zoned for agricultural use and is at least 5 contiguous acres in size, and (2) the product is licensed as Kentucky Proud under KRS 260. 016 to 260.019.
Part III: Fiscal Explanation, Bill Provisions, and Estimated Cost
The fiscal impact of HB 259 on a local governments is minimal.
The only cost to local governments would likely come from amending their planning and zoning ordinances to include production of hand-crafted items as an agricultural use, permissible in an area zoned for such use. This cost would be minimal.
