BILL SPONSOR(S): Rep. J. Hoover AMENDMENT SPONSOR(S): **SUBJECT:** AN ACT relating to penalties for driving under the influence and declaring an emergency. SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: Amend KRS 189A.010 to specify that, for the purposes of determining which prior DUI offenses affect penalty enhancement, offenses occurring after April 9, 2016, are measured within a ten-year look-back window, while offenses which occurred on or before April 9, 2016, are limited to a five-year look-back window under the previous version of the statute; amend KRS 189A.070 to conform: EMERGENCY. STATE IMPACT: Class A, B & C felonies are based on an average daily prison rate of \$66.82. Most Class D felons are housed in one of 76 full service jails for up to 5 years. DOC's cost to incarcerate a felony inmate in a jail is \$31.41 per day (includes jail per diem, medical & central office costs), not including substance abuse treatment. Projections are based on the daily rate x 365 x number of years. NONE MINIMAL MINIMAL MODERATE SIGNIFICANT **Projected Impact:** Potential Impact: The legislation proposes, for purposes of determining additional DUI offenses, to set a date which measures the 10 year period timeframe. If the offense occurred after April 9, 2016, it sets the ten year look-back period currently in statute. If the offense occurred on or before April 9, 2016, however, the offender would be subject to a five year look-back period as was in effect at the time of the prior DUI offense. The same timeframes are applied to revocation of a driver's license due to a DUI conviction. According to AOC, in CY2016 there were 68 Class D felony DUI convictions for DUI 4th or Subsequent Offense. Currently, DOC has 100 offenders incarcerated for DUI convictions for DUI 4th or Subsequent Offense. The legislation could result in fewer offenders receiving convictions for subsequent DUI offenses and the associated increased penalties. Under this legislation, the impact of increased penalties for multiple DUI offenses would not be as significant. A Class D Felony sentence is 1 to 5 years. 10 Class D Felons cost \$114,640 to \$573,200 100 Class D Felons cost \$1.146M to \$5.7M 1 Class D Felon costs KY \$11,464 to \$57,320 LOCAL IMPACT: Local governments are responsible for the cost of incarcerating individuals charged with Class A or B misdemeanors and felony defendants until disposition of the case. While the expense varies by jail, this estimated impact will be based on \$31.34 per day, which equals the per diem and medical that DOC pays jails to house felony offenders. **IMODERATE** MINIMAL MINIMAL Projected Impact: NONE SIGNIFICANT Potential Impact: The legislation could result in fewer offenders receiving convictions for subsequent DUI offenses and the associated increased penalties. The date for the ten year look back period would only be applicable from when that statutory revision was enacted in
