**MEASURE'S PURPOSE:** This measure requires telecommunicators that provide dispatch for emergency medical conditions to be trained in telephone cardiopulmonary resuscitation (T-CPR) and authorizes certain reciprocal agreements to be made between public safety answering points (PSAPs) and other agencies receiving or dispatching emergency medical service calls.

**PROVISIONS/MECHANICS:** Section 1 amends KRS 15.550 to require telecommunicators that provide dispatch for emergency medical conditions to be trained in T-CPR. It permits online T-CPR training modules as an acceptable means of training.

Section 2 creates a new Section of KRS 15.530 to 15.590 to permit public safety answering points (PSAPs) or other agencies receiving or dispatching emergency medical service calls to enter into reciprocal agreements with another PSAP, dedicated phone line, or call center to provide T-CPR. It dictates that employees of a PSAP that answer calls provide telephonic assistance in administering CPR directly or transfer the calls to a dedicated phone line, call center, or other PSAP that has a reciprocal agreement with the PSAP receiving the original call.

**FISCAL EXPLANATION:** The Department of Criminal Justice Training and the Kentucky State Police stated that this legislation poses no fiscal impact as these agencies currently provide this training.
