Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government

HB 455 Section 1 would create a new section of KRS 311.710 to 311.820 to prohibit a person intentionally performing or inducing an abortion if the person knows the pregnant woman is seeking the abortion, in whole or in part, because the unborn child has Down syndrome.

Section 3 of the bill would amend KRS 311.990 to establish that violation of the prohibition by anyone other than the pregnant woman would be a Class D felony.

HB 455 would result in a minimum number of additional Class D felony arrests and incarcerations, and so would have a minimum negative fiscal impact on local jails and law enforcement. When a court denies bail to a Class D felony defendant, the local government is responsible for incarcerating the defendant until disposition of the case in one of Kentucky's 76 full service jails or four life safety jails. While the expense of housing inmates varies by jail, each additional inmate increases facility costs by an estimated average of \$31.34 per day, which equals the per diem and medical expenses that the Department of Corrections pays jails to house felony offenders. The Department of

Corrections pays local jails \$31.34 per day to house these Class D felons. Since the per diem pays for the estimated average cost of housing a Class D felon, the per diem may be less than, equal to, or greater than the actual housing cost.
