Westerfield AMENDMENT SPONSOR(S): **SUBJECT:** AN ACT relating to crimes and punishments. **SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION:** Amend KRS 510.010 to include penetration by body parts in definitions of "sexual intercourse" and " deviate sexual intercourse" for purposes of describing the crimes of rape and sodomy. Most Class D felons are housed in one of 76 full service jails for up to 5 years. DOC's cost to incarcerate a felony inmate in a jail is \$31.45 per day (includes jail per diem, medical & central office costs), not including substance abuse treatment. Currently, the definitions of "sexual intercourse" and "deviate sexual intercourse" in KRS 510.010, which apply to Rape, Sodomy and Sexual Misconduct offenses in KRS Chapter 510 only include penetration of the sex organs, mouth, or anus of a victim by the sex organs of an offender or by a foreign object manipulated by the offender. Penetration of the sex organs, mouth, or anus of a victim by "other body parts" of the offender are currently considered "sexual contact" as defined in KRS 510.010, which supports charges of Sexual Abuse, but not Rape or Sodomy. Under the proposed legislation, the definitions of "sexual intercourse" and "deviate sexual intercourse" would be amended to include penetration by "any body part", resulting in what would currently be various degrees of Sexual Abuse to be charged as Rape or Sodomy offenses.

SB 109 amends definitions of "sexual intercourse" and "deviate sexual intercourse" established in KRS 510.010 to include

penetration by any body part.

Sexual Abuse 1st Degree is a Class D felony, unless the victim is under the age of twelve, in which case it is a Class C felony. Sexual Abuse 2nd Degree is a Class A misdemeanor.

AOC reports 552 convictions for Sexual Abuse in FY2017, with 428 at a Class D felony level and 124 at the misdemeanor level.

Under this legislation, acts which previously may have been prosecuted as a lower offense may be charged at a higher level. For example, Class D Sexual Assault 1st Degree may be prosecuted as Rape 1st Degree, a Class B felony.

Rape 1<sup>st</sup> & Sodomy 1<sup>st</sup> Degree are Class B felonies unless the victim is under the age of twelve or receives a serious physical injury, in which it is a Class A felony; Rape 2<sup>nd</sup> & Sodomy 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree are Class C felonies; Rape 3<sup>rd</sup> & Sodomy 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree are Class D felonies; and Sodomy 4<sup>th</sup> Degree is a Class A misdemeanor.

The impact of this legislation is not known. It is anticipated that several offenses which previously would have been Sexual Abuse convictions may well be prosecuted under this legislation as Rape or Sodomy offenses at a higher felony level.

The fiscal impact of a higher offense level would include increased sentence lengths and a higher cost to incarcerate. Class A to Class C sex offenses would be subject to housing at a prison facility at a cost of \$70.12 per day. Inmates serving on Rape or Sodomy 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree serve Class D sentences at either a jail or prison facility, depending on the length of their sentence, as outlined in KRS 532.100. The cost to incarcerate at a jail facility is \$31.45 per day. Additionally, as a more serious offense, the offender may be less likely to be granted paroled, resulting in longer incarceration periods.

It is not known how many of the 428 felony Sexual Abuse convictions from FY2017 would, if SB 109 were in effect at the time of conviction, possess elements that would elevate the offense from Class D Sexual Abuse to a higher felony Rape or Sodomy charge. If 10% were to qualify for a Rape 1st or Sodomy 1st offense and receive a sentence of incarceration, at an annual cost to incarcerate of \$25,594.44 (\$14,113.64 more expensive than a Class D felony), the increased incarceration cost would be \$604,063.79 per year.
