<u>PURPOSE OF MEASURE</u>: The purpose of the measure is to require all public schools to offer visual and performing arts instruction.

FISCAL EXPLANATION: Section 1 requires The Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) to develop standards and guidelines for visual and performing arts. KDE has most recently revised the social studies standards. Those associated costs exceeded \$56,000 and were used as the baseline costs for the analysis on HB 37. The costs associated with updating standards include staff time, travel, convening educator workgroups, and distributing materials. There are no projected recurring costs at the state level after the new standards and guidelines are developed.

This analysis does not consider the impact to local school districts, which are outside the purview of this fiscal note.
