		STATE IMPACT : Class A, B, & C felonies are based on an average daily prison rate of \$75.91. Community Custody Class C and most Class D felons are housed in one of seventy-seven (77) full service or regional jails for up to five (5) years. Department of Corrections' cost to incarcerate a felony inmate in a jail is \$36.70 per day, which includes \$31.34 per diem, medical costs, & central office administrative costs (substance abuse treatment not included). <i>Projections are based on the daily rate x 365 days x number of years. Offenders may have multiple offenses or incarcerated on other charges unless otherwise noted. Unless otherwise noted, numbers will include inchoate offenses at the underlying offense level.</i>

SB 135 amends KRS 510.010 by expanding language defining sexual contact. Current statute indicates sexual contact as touching of the sexual or other intimate parts of a person for the purpose of gratifying the sexual desire of either party.			
Proposed language expands this definition to sexual contact with intent to harm, threaten, intimidate, abuse, humiliate, harass, degrade, arouse, coerce, or for sexual gratification.			
Overall, the expansion to the definition of sexual contact could provide additional behavior that would be defined as sexual contact and thus be charged under KRS as a sex offense. For example, Sexual Abuse 1st Degree involves subjecting another person to sexual contact by forcible compulsion.			
Under the legislation there may be individuals who exhibit behavior which now could be subject to more serious criminal charges and would be identified as a sex offender. It is not possible to estimate the impact this wording change could have on additional convictions.

Under KRS 532.100 Class D offenders would serve their offense in a state prison facility if the sentence is two (2) years or more at a daily cost of \$75.91. If the sentence is under two (2) years, placement would be at a county detention facility at a cost to the state of \$36.70 per day. County jails would receive \$31.34 per day for housing of the state inmate.

The proposed language may also impact offenses such as Sexual Abuse 2nd Degree or Sexual Abuse 3rd Degree which are Class A & Class B misdemeanors, respectively. Misdemeanors are subject to the jurisdiction and cost of the county.

It is not known how the amended definition of sexual contact may impact convictions under these offenses.
