**PURPOSE OF MEASURE:** The bill requires the Department of Agriculture to develop and provide a training program, and requires local animal control officers complete the training annually.

**FISCAL EXPLANATION:** The bill allows the Department of Agriculture to assess a fee to cover the costs of providing the training program. The Department of Agriculture has stated the estimated costs to provide the trainings are indeterminable at this time. However, the Department intends to assess a fee to cover, but not exceed, those costs, therefore the bill has a net zero fiscal impact.
