**PURPOSE OF MEASURE:** This bill would establish an Office of Innovation at the Department of Agriculture to plan and coordinate broadband deployment to unserved and underserved parts of the state. The bill would remove the Broadband Deployment Fund from the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) and place it in the newly created Office of Innovation at the Department of Agriculture.

**FISCAL EXPLANATION:** The bill would likely result in additional revenue from Federal Funds and additional General Fund expenditures, but the full fiscal impact of the bill is indeterminable.

The Broadband Deployment Fund was initially established at the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority in the 2020 Regular Session. Since there have been no funds appropriated to it, nor has KIA assigned any staff to administer the fund, the bill would have no fiscal impact on KIA.

The Department of Agriculture estimates that the bill would have an initial cost of \$1,000,000 from the General Fund in FY22. These costs include approximately \$500,000 to contract with an external consultant to study and develop the statewide broadband plan outlined in Section 3 of the bill and another \$500,000 for personnel for three to five new positions to administer the program. The Department states that while \$500,000 would be required for personnel costs at

full implementation, there is potential for Federal Funds to eventually supplement General Fund, as some federal grant awards include certain amounts to support administrative costs.

Once the Department staffs the new Office of Innovation and completes the statewide broadband deployment plan, the Department claims that the state will become eligible to receive federal grant awards from various federal programs. The award amounts the state could receive and timetable for when the state could receive them are both indeterminable.
