Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government

KRS Chapter 39A deals with statewide emergency management programs and the state's liability.

HB 432 removes the sovereign immunity waivers for local governments for the following scenarios:

- Personal injury or property damage caused by any member of any agency engaged in any emergency management or disaster and emergency services or disaster and emergency response activity;
- Death of or injury to persons, or for property damage caused by a volunteer or auxiliary disaster and emergency response worker who is enrolled or registered

with a local disaster and emergency services organization or with the local government;

- Death of or injury to any person on or about property that the person owning or having controlling interest in has voluntarily without compensation allowed the property to be used as shelter during an actual, impending, mock, or practice disaster or emergency.

HB 432 removes language reflecting a line of overruled cases and that may have been construed as a waiver of immunity based on the maintenance of insurance or self-insurance.

The effect of HB 432 on local governments will be indeterminable, but could be a substantial savings. The general assembly appears to limit avenues of liability of governments and other actors in the emergency scenarios.
