TITLE: AN ACT relating to assault on a service animal.

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: Amend KRS 525.200 to remove the exemption of assistance dogs from the definition of a service dog.

STATE IMPACT: Class A, B, & C felonies are based on an average daily prison rate of \$80.24. Community Custody Class C and most Class D felons are housed in one of seventy-seven (77) full service or regional jails for up to five (5) years. Department of Corrections' cost to incarcerate a felony inmate in a jail is \$37.35 per day, which includes \$31.34 per diem, medical costs, & central office administrative costs (substance abuse treatment not included).*

The proposed legislation amends KRS 525.200 by deleting language stating that a service animal has the same meaning as KRS 525.010, except a service animal does not include assistance dogs.

Assault on an assistance dog would therefore qualify for the Class D criminal offense of Assault on a Service Animal 1st Degree. Currently an assault on an assistance dog could be charged at the misdemeanor level as an Assault on a Service Animal 2nd Degree.

- According to data provided by AOC, in FY2019 there were zero (0) felony convictions for felony Assault on a Service Animal 1st Degree and five (5) misdemeanor convictions for Assault on a Service Animal 2nd Degree. (Note: Includes inchoate offenses.)
- The Department's records do not distinguish the type of service animal that was involved in an Assault on a Service Animal, so it is unknown if the one (1) offender who is currently incarcerated for a conviction of Assault of a Service Animal 1st Degree was an assault conducted on an assistance dog. In addition, there are two (2) offenders on supervision for felony Assault on a Service Animal 1st Degree and three (3) offenders on supervision for misdemeanor Assault on a Service Animal 2nd Degree.
- Offenders convicted under Assault on a Service Animal 1st Degree would be a Class D felon housed in a county jail as a state inmate.

The Department cannot project how many additional offenses would be generated from the addition of assistance dogs to this statute; however, given the overall number of convictions involving service animals, the impact to DOC and resulting incarceration costs would be minimal.

Cost to Incarcerate

A Class D Felony sentence is 1 to 5 years. 1 Class D Felon costs KY \$13,634.54 to \$68,172.72 10 Class D Felons cost KY \$136,345.44 to \$681,727.22 100 Class D Felons cost KY \$1,363,454.45 to \$6,817,272.25

LOCAL IMPACT: Local governments are responsible for the cost of incarcerating individuals charged with Class A or B misdemeanors and felony defendants until disposition of the case. The estimated impact will be based on the \$37.35 cost to

incarcerate while \$31.34 is the per diem and medical that DOC pays jails to house felony offenders. Since the cost to incarcerate is an estimated average cost of housing an inmate, this may not be the actual housing cost for the jail.*

Projected Impact: INONE MINIMAL to MODERATE (< \$1 million) SIGNIFICANT (> \$1 million)

As a Class D offender, offenders subject to incarceration for Assault on a Service Animal would serve their sentence in a county jail at a cost to the state of \$37.35, with the jail receiving \$31.34 in daily reimbursement.

There is no change to KRS 525.205 under this legislation.

 Assault on a Service Animal 2nd Degree is a Class B misdemeanor. Misdemeanors are subject to the jurisdiction and cost of the county.

The projected impact to local jails from this legislation would be minimal.
