**PURPOSE OF MEASURE:** The purpose of the measure is to allow high school students enrolled during the 2020-2021 school year to supplement or retake courses in the 2021-2022 school year if approved by the district.

**FISCAL EXPLANATION:** There is no fiscal impact in fiscal year 2021-2022 because the average daily attendance used to calculate SEEK for the 2021-2022 school year has been frozen based on attendance data selected by the district pursuant to 2020 Senate Bill 177.

The legislation would increase SEEK expenditures at full implementation by an indeterminable amount because high school students that retake or supplement courses from the 2020-2021 school year would impact the average daily attendance used to calculate SEEK in FY 2022-2023.
