**PURPOSE OF MEASURE:** The measure changes the junior statewide hunting license to the youth statewide hunting license and removes the required parental (guardian, custodian etc.) permission to obtain a youth statewide hunting license for those under 16. It removes the requirement that the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources name each county clerk not granted an exemption from selling licenses as an agent for the sale of licenses and permits. HB 344 allows the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources to name any other person, governmental entity, business or organization meeting the requirements specified by statute and by the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources by administrative regulation as agents for the sale of specified licenses and permits for the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources.
