**Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local
Government**

To achieve certification or to remain certified, current law requires a peace officer must complete annual in-service training for peace officer intervention response at least once every two years. SB 287 requires the Justice and Public Safety Cabinet to provide at least three additional hours of peace officer intervention response training annually.

The fiscal impact of SB 287 on local governments is expected to be minimal. KRS 15.440(1)(e) currently requires forty hours of in-service training for certification as it relates to annual supplemental pay for qualified officers. The three additional hours every other year as required by SB 287 should not be a hardship for either the department or the officer, and will not result in direct material cost to local government beyond current training expenses.
