Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government

HB 138 repeals KRS 237.115, which gives local government units the authority to prohibit the carrying of concealed deadly weapons in government buildings. It also amends KRS 237.110 to specify that the prohibition of carrying concealed deadly weapons in airports is limited to those areas control by the Transportation Security Administration and KRS 527.070 to add persons with valid concealed carry license to the list of individuals permitted to possess weapons in schools.

The fiscal impact of HB 138 should be minimal.

Passage of HB 138 will require some units of local government to update their policies, procedures, and training, which will have an indeterminable administrative cost.
