### Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government

HB 415 creates a new section of KRS Chapter 186A to define nonmotorized vehicles and require that all such vehicles be registered for operating on public highways; require display of registration plate on the rear of all nonmotorized vehicles; set forth procedures for issuing registration by county clerks and direct the Transportation Cabinet to administer regulations and establish forms and procedures.

The fiscal impact of HB 415 on local government is indeterminable, but most likely will include a slight increase in county clerk employee's workload and an increase in the amount of money clerk's offices receive from nonmotorized vehicle registration fees.

According to officials with Kentucky County Clerk's Association, HB 415 would require some training of staff on the new law and very slightly increase their workload.

The registration of nonmotorized vehicles under the provisions of HB 415 will be the same as for a motor vehicle under KRS 156.050(1)(a) and KRS 186.040. County clerk offices will receive a \$6 fee for each issued registration, \$9 if registration exceeds twelve months, and \$30 for vehicles over 44,000 lbs. An estimate of how much increase each county clerk's office will receive is not possible because it is not known how many nonmotorized vehicles will need to be registered in each county.

## Part III: Differences to Local Government Mandate Statement from Prior Versions

The analysis presented above in part II is for HB 415 as introduced. No previous versions exist for comparison.
