TITLE: AN ACT relating to adult-oriented businesses.

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: Create new sections of KRS Chapter 231 to express the findings of the General Assembly relating to adult-oriented businesses and the need for regulation; define terms; establish distance parameters for the location of adult-oriented businesses in proximity to identified entities and locations; establish transition provisions for existing businesses; affirm the authority of local governmental units to supplement regulation of adult-oriented businesses.

AMENDMENT: SCS 1: Remove original provisions; create a new section of KRS Chapter 525 to define "adult performance"; establish the offense of engaging in an adult performance; establish penalties; create a new section of KRS Chapter 231 to establish available sanctions for allowing an adult performance at a business when minors are present.

SFA 2: Amend the definition of "adult performance" to establish the performance appeals to a prurient interest in sexual conduct and lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value.

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STATE IMPACT: Class A, B, & C felonies are based on an average daily prison rate of \$105.23. Community Custody Class C and most Class D felons are housed in one of seventy-four (74) full service or regional jails for up to five (5) years. Department of Corrections' cost to incarcerate a felony inmate in a jail is \$40.11 per day, which includes \$35.34 per diem, medical costs, & central office administrative costs (substance abuse treatment not included).*

Projected Impact: NONE MINIMAL to MODERATE (< \$1 million) SIGNIFICANT (> \$1 million)

There is no impact to the Department of Corrections as originally introduced.

LOCAL IMPACT: Local governments are responsible for the cost of incarcerating individuals charged with Class A or B misdemeanors and felony defendants until disposition of the case. The estimated impact will be based on the \$40.11 cost to incarcerate for the Department of Corrections, including \$35.34 per diem and medical that DOC pays jails to house felony offenders. This cost to incarcerate may not be the actual housing cost for the jail.*

Projected Impact: NONE MINIMAL to MODERATE (< \$1 million) SIGNIFICANT (> \$1 million)

There is no impact to the Department of Corrections as originally introduced.

PROJECTED IMPACT FROM AMENDMENTS:

State Impact from SCS 1:

Establishing new felony and misdemeanor offenders would impact the number of offenders potentially incarcerated and/or placed on supervision.

While there is no way to predict the number of new convictions this legislation would generate, the number of convictions would likely be few. The expected impact to the Department under this legislation would be minimal increase to incarceration costs.

Class D felons are housed in a county jail and DOC pays counties a per diem for housing those inmates. A Class D Felony sentence is 1 to 5 years – One (1) Class D Felon costs KY \$14,638.94 to \$73,194.71.

Local Impact from SCS1:

Establishing new felony and misdemeanor offenses could result in additional county prisoners being housed in county jails, but the impact is expected to be minimal.

Class D felons are housed in a county jail and DOC pays counties a per diem for housing those inmates. A Class D Felony sentence is 1 to 5 years – One (1) Class D Felon costs KY \$14,638.94 to \$73,194.71.

Misdemeanor offenders are subject to the jurisdiction and cost of the county. A Class A misdemeanor is 90 days to 1 year in jail. A Class B misdemeanor is up to 90 days in jail.

The GA version of this bill has no additional impact.


