PURPOSE OF MEASURE: This measure creates a new section of KRS 61.870 to 61.884 to establish minimum hourly requirements for all new and current officers and employees of public agencies and official custodians to complete open records training within 12 months or 90 days of employment or election. Official custodians are required to complete open records training every two years so long as they remain the official custodian. It requires the Attorney General to maintain a database of official custodians and publish the contact information on their website.

FISCAL EXPLANATION: The Office of the Attorney General would need to hire at least one full-time attorney to conduct the Attorney General-led trainings and to review the agencies' trainings. This need would depend on the number of trainings required and the number of agencies that conducted their own trainings. The total cost would be at least \$138,000 which represents the salary, fringe, and operating cost of one full-time attorney.
