Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government
HB 522 proposes to amend KRS 100.987 stating a planning unit, legislative body, or fiscal court that has adopted planning and zoning regulations, shall not approve the siting of a cellular antenna tower capable of providing fifth generation or 5G mobile communications service within 1,640 feet of any residentially zoned area, park, playground, hospital, nursing home, daycare center, or school.
HB 522 would have minimal impact on local governments related to amending planning documents. According to Kentucky League of Cities, most cities, especially the smaller ones, retain their city attorney on contract and pay on an hourly basis. Currently (FY 2023), the average hourly rate was between \$117 and \$128.
