Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government

Section 1 adds offenses to the list of those which require a period of postincarceration supervision following release from incarceration or completion of parole. These include any felony attempt to commit a felony offense under KRS Chapter 510 and violations of KRS 531.320 to 531.370.

Section 2 amends KRS 532.060 to add the preceding offenses, including human trafficking when involving commercial sexual activity, to the felonies which require an additional five year period of postincarceration supervision be added to the maximum sentence rendered for the offense.

The expected fiscal impact of SB 32 is indeterminable. There may be an increase in the number of recently incarcerated people required to participate in postincarceration supervision as a result of the bill, which may result in an increase in the number of incarcerated people, if there are violations of the terms of the supervision. However, this number and the resulting costs are indeterminable.
