**PURPOSE OF MEASURE:** The legislation appropriates General Fund moneys from the Juul settlement to the Cabinet for Health and Family Services to support the smoking cessation program within the Cabinet’s Department for Public Health.

**FISCAL EXPLANATION:** House Bill 813 appropriates General Fund from the Juul settlement in the amount of \$1 million in FY 2024, \$1 million in FY 2025, and \$1.5 million in FY 2026 to support the smoking cessation program.
