## Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government

HB 157/PHS 1 would exempt the fees for initial and renewal veterans and Kentucky National Guard special license plates. Currently the fee for a veterans license plate is \$23 for initial plate and renewal. The current fee for a Kentucky National Guard license plate is \$23 for initial and \$11 for renewal. The county clerk retains \$5 for each initial or renewal veterans or Kentucky National Guard plate.

**HB 157/PHS 1 would have a significant negative fiscal impact on county clerk revenues.** If the plate issuance and renewal numbers for 2024 remain consistent, HB 157/PHS is expected to result in an annual estimated revenue loss of \$635,820 for the county clerks. However, the total fiscal impact on county clerk revenue would likely increase above this number due to the removal of fees. Some individuals who qualify for the free veteran plates, but usually obtain any other license plate, would likely choose the free veterans license plate going forward. The Transportation Cabinet has provided the number of plates issued and renewed for the 2024 calendar year. The chart below shows the type of military plates and the expected loss of county clerk revenue.
