**Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government**

HB 662 would add a new section to KRS Chapter 61 relating to personally identifiable information for judicial officers and immediate family members.

State government agencies would be prohibited from disclosing personally identifiable information of individuals if a judicial officer or their immediate family member submits a written request to refrain from such disclosure. Once a request is received, the agency must remove the personally identifiable information within 72 hours. Any disclosed information cannot be reposted unless voluntarily made public by the covered person. A covered person may bring civil action seeking injunctive or declaratory relief to enforce this section in court.

**The fiscal impact of HB 662 on local government is indeterminable but likely negative.** Local agencies may incur administrative costs related to processing of written requests and removal of information. This legislation allows for civil actions if agencies do not comply which could result in legal costs for local governments when in violation of proposed provisions.
