**Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government**

HB 667 Creates new sections of KRS Chapter 237, relating to firearms. The bill provides that firearms manufactured in Kentucky shall not be subject to federal law or regulation and that all firearms manufactured and sold in Kentucky to have the words "Made in Kentucky" clearly stamped on them.

Section 5 of the bill relates to local governments. It would prohibit local governments from adopting rules, orders, policies, or ordinances to enforce federal firearm regulations.

**HB 667 will have a no fiscal impact on local governments that comply with the provisions of the bill.** A local government that chooses to violate HB 667 will be subject to the withholding of their state grant funds.
