Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government

HB 96 defines "coercive control" and adds it to the definitions of "dating violence and "dating violence and abuse." HB 96 also defines "stalking" and adds "coercive control" in relation to orders of protection.

HS 97 PHS 1 amends KRS 403.720 remove engaging in sexual or reproductive coercion, communicating the intent to contact local or federal agencies based on actual or suspected immigration status, or engaging in vexatious or abusive litigation from the definition of "coercive control."

HB 97 PHS 1 also amends KRS 456.010 to remove engaging in sexual or reproductive coercion, communicating the intent to contact local or federal agencies based on actual or suspected immigration status, or engaging in vexatious or abusive litigation from the definition of "coercive control."

HB 96 PHS 1 will have an indeterminable, but minimal negative fiscal impact on local governments. The changes may result in an increase of domestic violence orders and inter-personal protective orders for peace officers to serve and respond to.
