PURPOSE OF MEASURE: The subjection resolution expresses the General Assembly’s support for the Southern Regional Education Board’s (SREB) Crisis Recovery Support Network by transmitting a copy of the resolution to various state government officers.

FISCAL EXPLANATION: The Clerk of the Senate can accomplish the transmittal using existing resources. Therefore, there is no state fiscal impact associated with the resolution.

The resolution mentions that SREB may ask states to provide an additional \$10,000 to help sustain counselor training operations. If the SREB does make that request, it will be made in two years, which would place the request in a subsequent biennial budget period. If the SREB makes the request, and the General Assembly further decides to appropriate funding to satisfy the request, then that action would have a state fiscal impact of increasing expenditures by \$10,000 for the Council on Postsecondary Education.
