**Part II: Bill Provisions and the Estimated Fiscal Impact Relating to Local Government**

SB 86 adds a new section of KRS Chapter 61 that requires local law enforcement agencies and the Kentucky State Police to participate in the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement’s Jail Enforcement Model, Task Force Model, and Warrant Service Officer Model programs.

**The fiscal impact of SB 86 is indeterminable, but expected to be negative.** Participation in this program would require local law enforcement to identify, process, and hold non-citizens in local jails. This would add additional duties to local law enforcement and state police as well as incurring costs to house non-citizens in local jails. While the expense of housing inmates varies by jail, this estimated impact will be based on an average cost to incarcerate of \$47.43 per day.
